Delia Murphy was a folk song collector and performer of folk and popular songs and became a favourite of Irish and international audiences in the 40's to 60's. In Hello Delia Murphy, her niece tells Delia's story, interspersed with performing her songs and illustrating her life and successes. As a young girl growing up in Mayo Delia benefited from the songs and stories she heard all around. Later they became part of her repertoire on a world stage. She became a pioneering folk singer in Ireland and abroad in the forties and fifties and established ballad singing as an acceptable song form. She was the first person to become a celebrity in this tradition and gave the Irish Ballad and folk songs the importance they hold in Irish and international music today.
