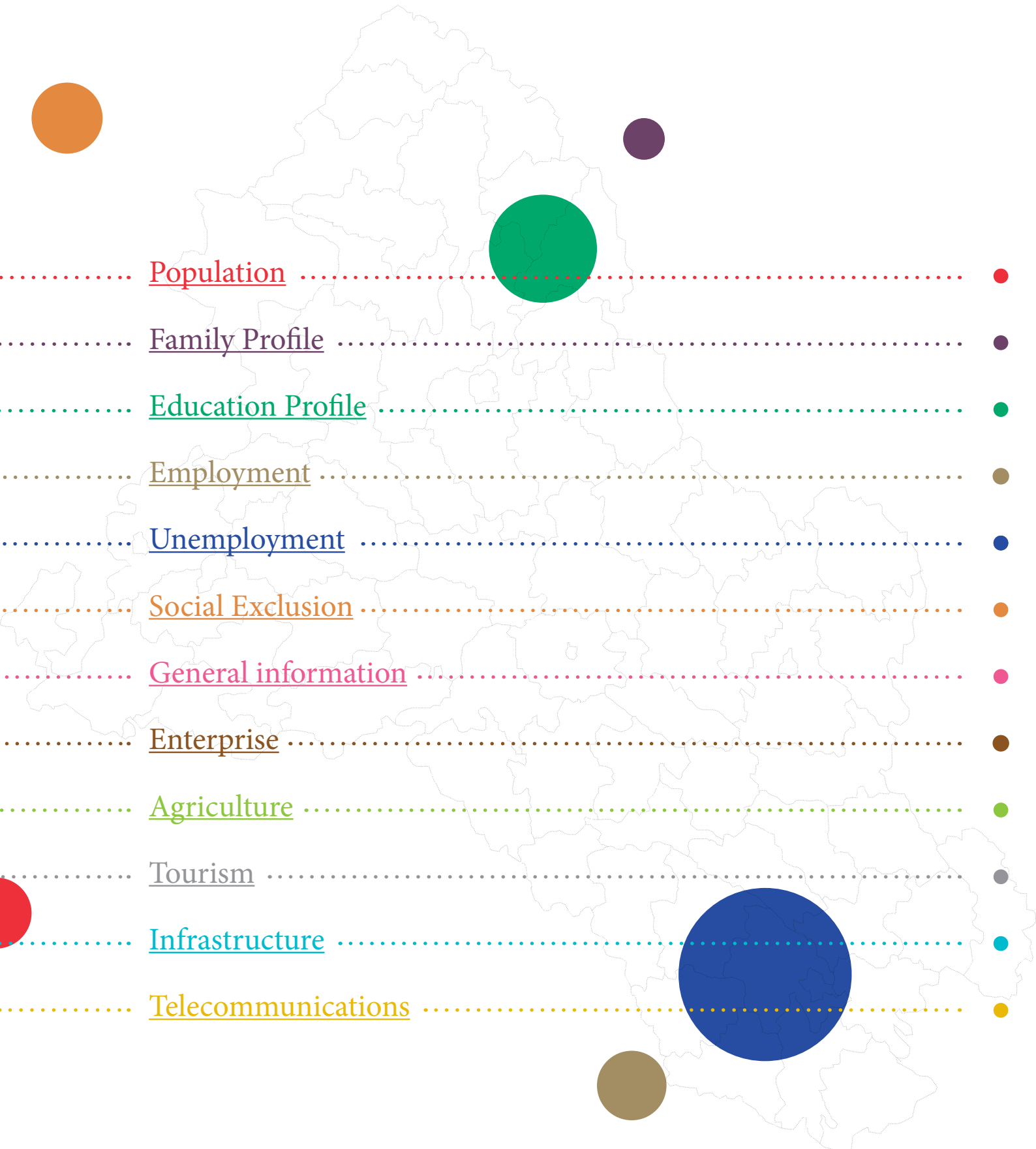

- Statistical data is presented at a number of different levels depending on relevance and availability of data. For the most part data is presented at Municipal District level, county level and state level. This allows for comparison of data sets.

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Presentation of statistical data

- The data collated for this socio-economic framework has been gathered primarily from the Central Statistics Office, which carries out a Census of Population every 5 years. The most recent Census was in 2011. Data relating to deprivation has been gathered from Pobal, the national anti-poverty agency, which commissioned Haase Pratschke to analyse the census information and give each District Electoral Division a score which compares the level of disadvantage/ affluence against the national average.
- Statistical data is presented at a number of different levels depending on relevance and availability of data. For the most part data is presented at Municipal District level, county level and state level. This allows for comparison of data sets.

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Section one: Setting the context

Monaghan County Council has prepared this data-based, socio-economic profile of the County as a central element to the development of its Local Economic and Community Plan 2015 –2017.

Following the enactment of the Local Government Reform Act 2014, local government is progressing through significant change. The focus of the Local Government Reform Act is to “make further and better provision in relation to local government” and “to provide for an increased role for local authorities in economic development and enterprise support”

(LG Reform Act 2014).

Collaborative working and integrated planning is embedded in the Putting People First document (October 2012) governing the reform of local government. This is further emphasised in the Local Government Reform Act 2014. Improved co-ordination and planning in the area of local development will enhance the role of local government and will result in more effective and efficient outcomes for local communities. Combined with the objectives within the publication of “Putting People First” (2012) this represents a significant change in government policy in relation to local government and aims to promote local government as:

“the main vehicle of government and public service at local level – leading economic, social and community development, delivering efficient and good value services and representing citizens and local communities effectively and accountably”

(Putting people First, 2012).

Setting the context

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Local Community Development Committees

The Local Government Reform Act 2014 includes the establishments of Local Community Development Committees (LCDC's) in each local authority area. Each LCDC is required to prepare a 5 year Local Economic and Community Plan for the areas covered by the LCDC, in this case Monaghan Local Community Development Committee. The Local Economic and Community Plan will set out the key priorities and goals for the Social, Economic and Community development of county Monaghan over the next 5 years (2015-2020). The Local Economic and Community plan will form part of a series of plans and strategies that have, and are currently being developed at national, local and regional level.

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Local Economic Community Plan

The local Economic and Community Plan will be prepared in two distinct elements:

- A local economic element (prepared and adopted by the Local Authority)
- A community development element (prepared and adopted by the LCDC)

The Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) comprises of three key themes:

- Theme 1 – Employment and Economic Activity
- Theme 2 – Education, Training and Skills
- Theme 3 – Poverty and Social Exclusion.

The community elements of the LECP will include priorities aimed at:

- Tackling poverty, disadvantage and social exclusion through support for basic services and other initiatives
- Supporting training and up-skilling;
- Creating and sustaining employment and self employment opportunities
- Investing in local development through community focused support and services
- Provision of infrastructure and community facilities
- Investment in physical regeneration and environmental improvements
- Supporting the capacity of local communities to improve their quality of life
- Supporting social enterprise, social capital, volunteering and active citizenship

- Developing integrated and evidence based approaches to local service planning and delivery
- Identifying the needs and priorities of local communities to enhance their well-being – sustainable solutions to make the best use of local assets, strengths and opportunities to address those needs and priorities
- Community involvement in policy development and decision-making processes

The economic elements of the LECP will include priorities aimed at:

- Creating and sustaining jobs
- Promoting enterprise and economic development
- Promoting foreign direct investment, indigenous industry, micro and small and medium enterprises, tourism, agriculture forestry, marine sectors and other natural resources sectors
- Identifying local attributes that are essential in enhancing local economic performance
- Supporting training and up-skilling

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Social Inclusion & Community Activation Programme (SICAP)

The Social Inclusion & Community Activation Programme is one of the government's key programmes through which inequality and disadvantage is to be addressed over the next three years. SICAP is underpinned by a number of key policies and strategies, including the Action Plan for Jobs and Pathways to Work. The tendering process for the delivery of the SCIAP programme will be managed by the Local Community Development Committee and POBAL.

The SICAP target groups are:

- Children and Families from Disadvantaged Areas
- Lone Parents
- New Communities (including Refugees/Asylum Seekers)
- People living in Disadvantaged Communities
- People with Disabilities
- Roma
- The Unemployed (including those not on the Live Register)
- Travellers
- Young Unemployed People from Disadvantaged areas

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Socio-Economic Framework

As part of this process of preparing a Local Community & Economic plan, it is a requirement to prepare a socio economic framework for County Monaghan. This framework will provide a context for the separate community and economic planning processes which will follow. The socio economic framework will set the out the picture of County Monaghan with regard to priorities and needs for social, economic and community development. This document gives context to the reality of the situation of County Monaghan, identifying similarities and differences with national social and economic trends. The Socio-Economic Framework will provide a focus for the key issues in Monaghan that need to be addressed in the LECP, based on an analysis of the present economic, social and cultural situation in the county.

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Administrative structures in county Monaghan

The re-structuring of local government in County Monaghan brought about the abolition of the five Town Councils and the establishment of three new Municipal Districts. These changes came into operation from the 1st of June, 2014. As and from this date Local Government will be operated by a single administration structure and will have a single corporate entity with headquarters at County Council Offices, The Glen, Monaghan. The Municipal Districts are designed to enhance democratic governance, subsidiary and accountability while also improving operational efficiency and value for money. Three Municipal Districts were established in County Monaghan. This document will outline the socio-economic trends and patterns emerging throughout the county and within each Municipal District area. Each Municipal District comprises of the existing District Electoral Divisions (DED's) in the county (where relevant).

Population

Overview of section two

The population of a county gives us factual information on who lives in the county. This chapter will set out a profile of the population of the county under the following sub-headings::

- Overall population of the county and where the population figures sit within the national profile.
- Population growth in the county from the period of 2006 Census and the 2011 Census, outline the areas of population growth and decline in the each DED in the county and how those trends relate to the national population growth trends.

- Age profile of the population within each age bracket collected in the Census 2011 and how the population trends in each Municipal District relate to the trend in the county and the state.
- Gender profile of the population across all Municipal Districts and all age brackets.

Population profile of County Monaghan

County Monaghan is a small Local Authority area, with one of the smallest populations in the country.

The census of 2011 recorded the population of Monaghan at 60,483, representing 1.3% of the State population and an increase of 8% from the population in 2006 which was recorded at 55,997. Monaghan’s position with the national population profile is outline in the table below.

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Population growth

Changes in the national population are influenced by four factors - births, deaths, immigration and emigration. The natural increase consists of births less deaths. Census 2011 results show that the population of County Monaghan has continued to grow since Census 2006, increasing by 4,498 persons to a population of 60,495. This represents an increase of 8.1% over the period. This growth rate is the same as the growth at national level of 8%. This increase is not uniform throughout the county. The statistics would indicate significant development in rural areas surrounding the main towns and along the primary route of the N2, while little population growth and in some instances population decline in rural areas removed from the main towns. The population is evenly spread throughout the Municipal Districts, with Monaghan Municipal District having a slightly larger population.

Monaghan remains a predominantly rural county, with less than 30% of the population living in an urban area, compared to a figure of 62% for the state. Nationally the number of people living in urban areas rose by 11% between 2006 -2011, while in County Monaghan the percentage of the population living in the five main towns decreased from 21.3% in 2006 to 20.1% in 2011.

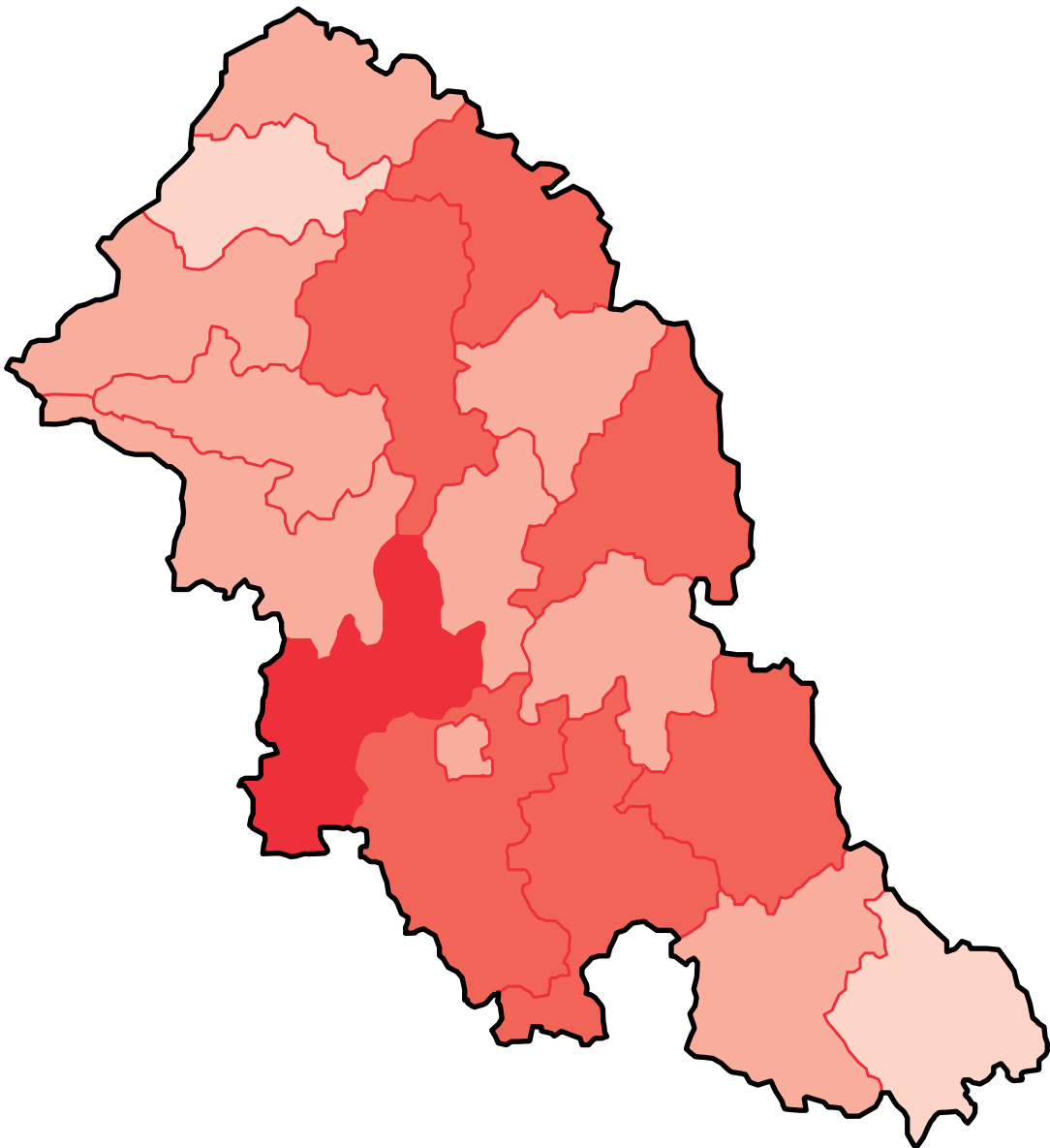

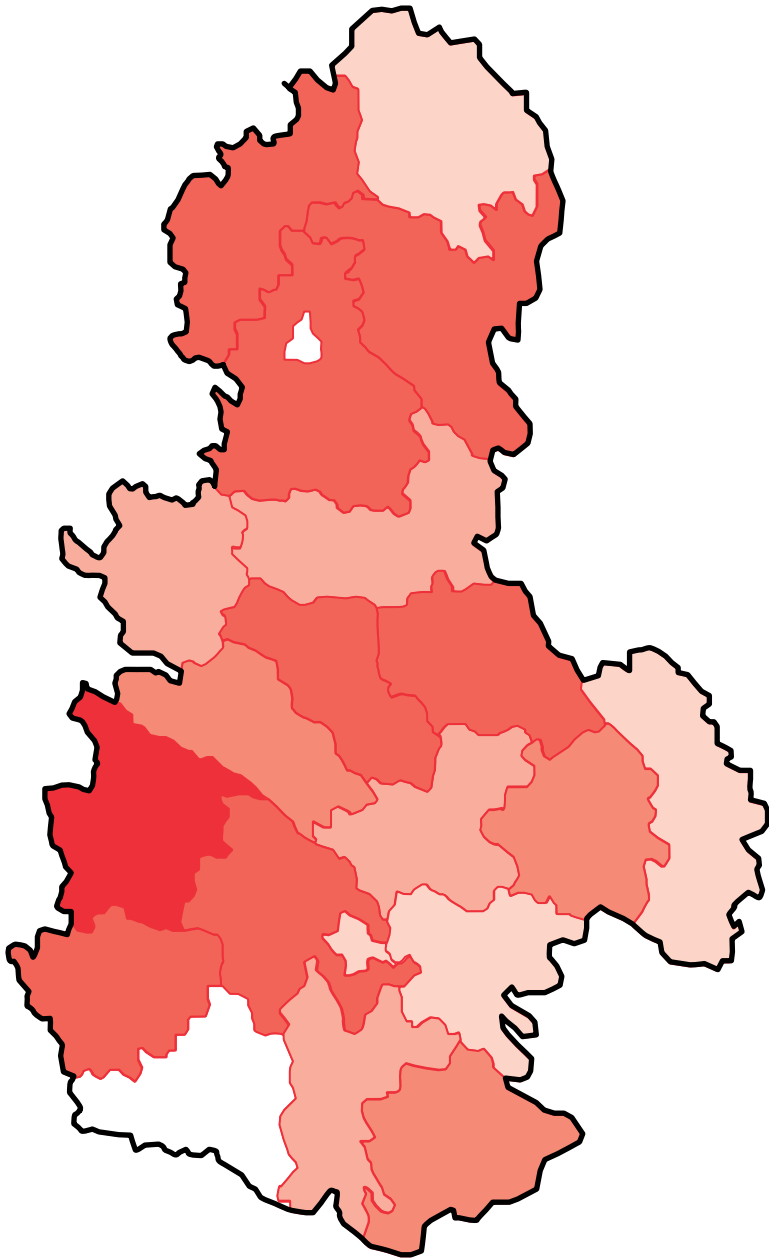

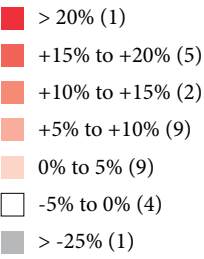

from 2006 to 2011

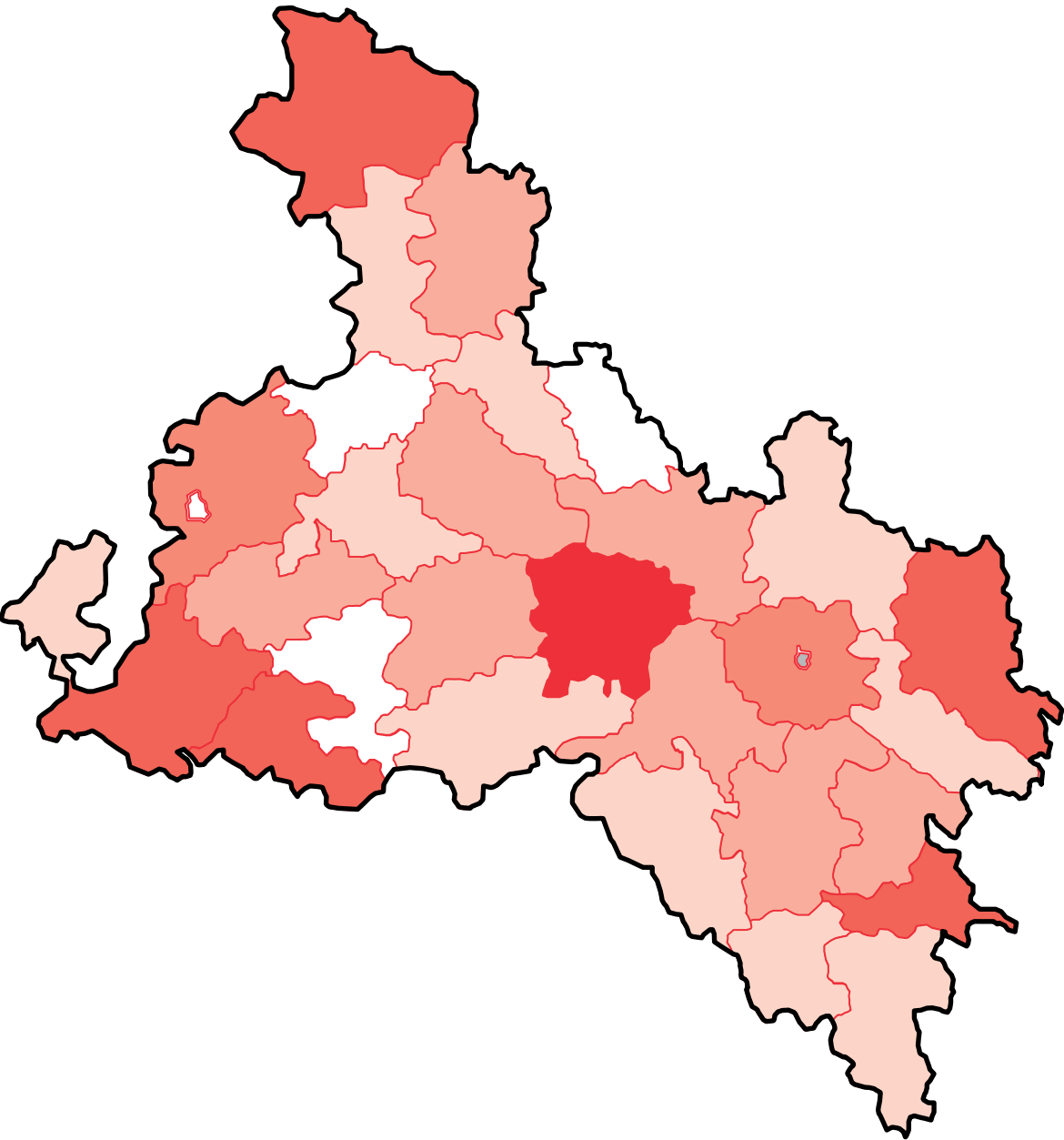
Population change Clones Ballybay

Age profile of population County Monaghan

The age profile of County Monaghan was in line with the national population for the majority of age brackets. This was also consistent through each Municipal District and DED's with no significant difference recording in the age profile of the population between the ages of 0-64. Moving into the 65+ bracket a different trend arose.

While the national figure of 12% is the same for County Monaghan, areas within the county have much larger older populations with Clones urban DED recording 37% of its population being people aged 65 and over which is over three times the national figure. These trends are reflected in the location of children and young people in the county, primarily in the rural communities surrounding the main towns of the county. While the more rural areas of the county recorded higher numbers of people over 65.

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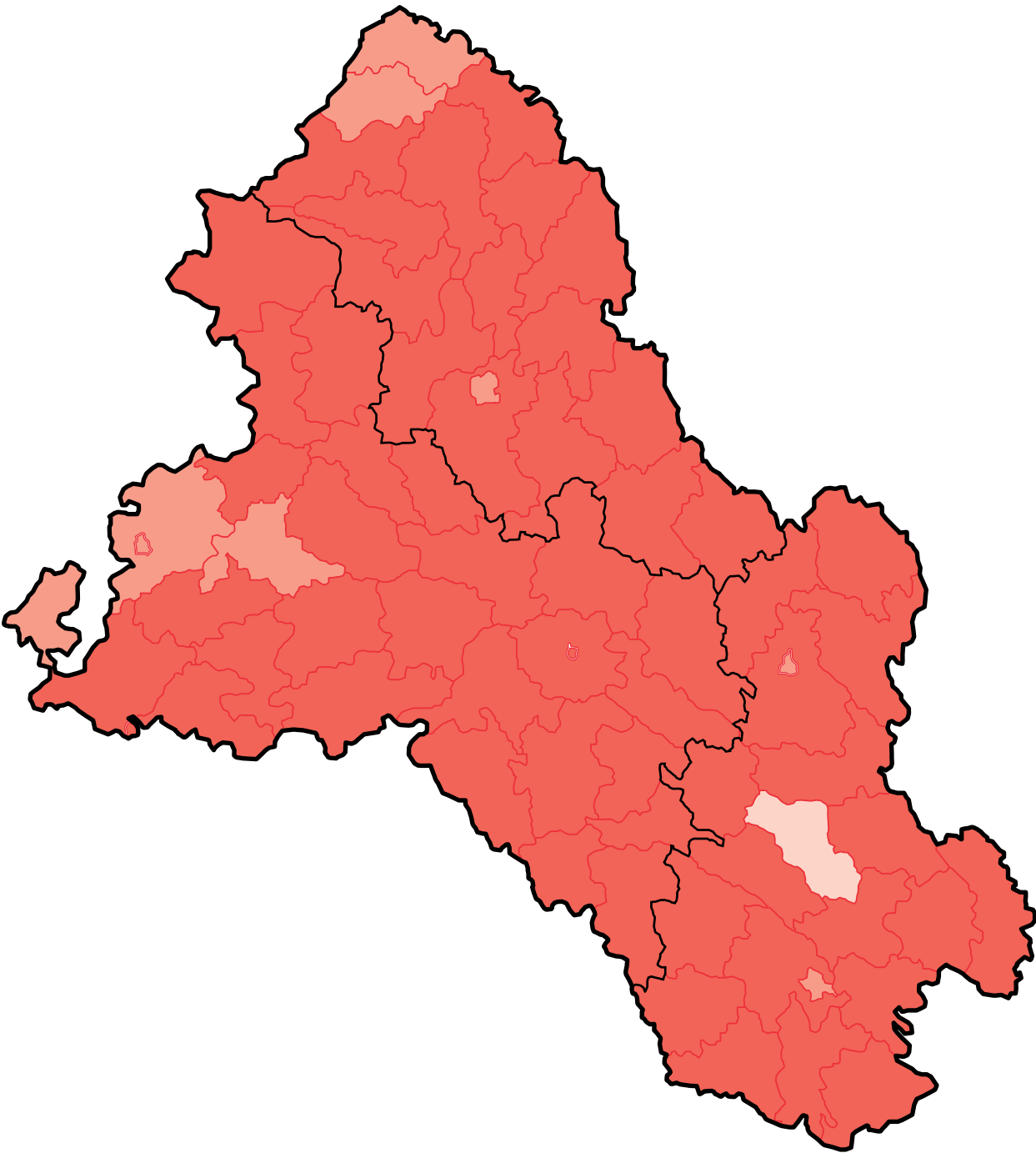

Workforce population profile

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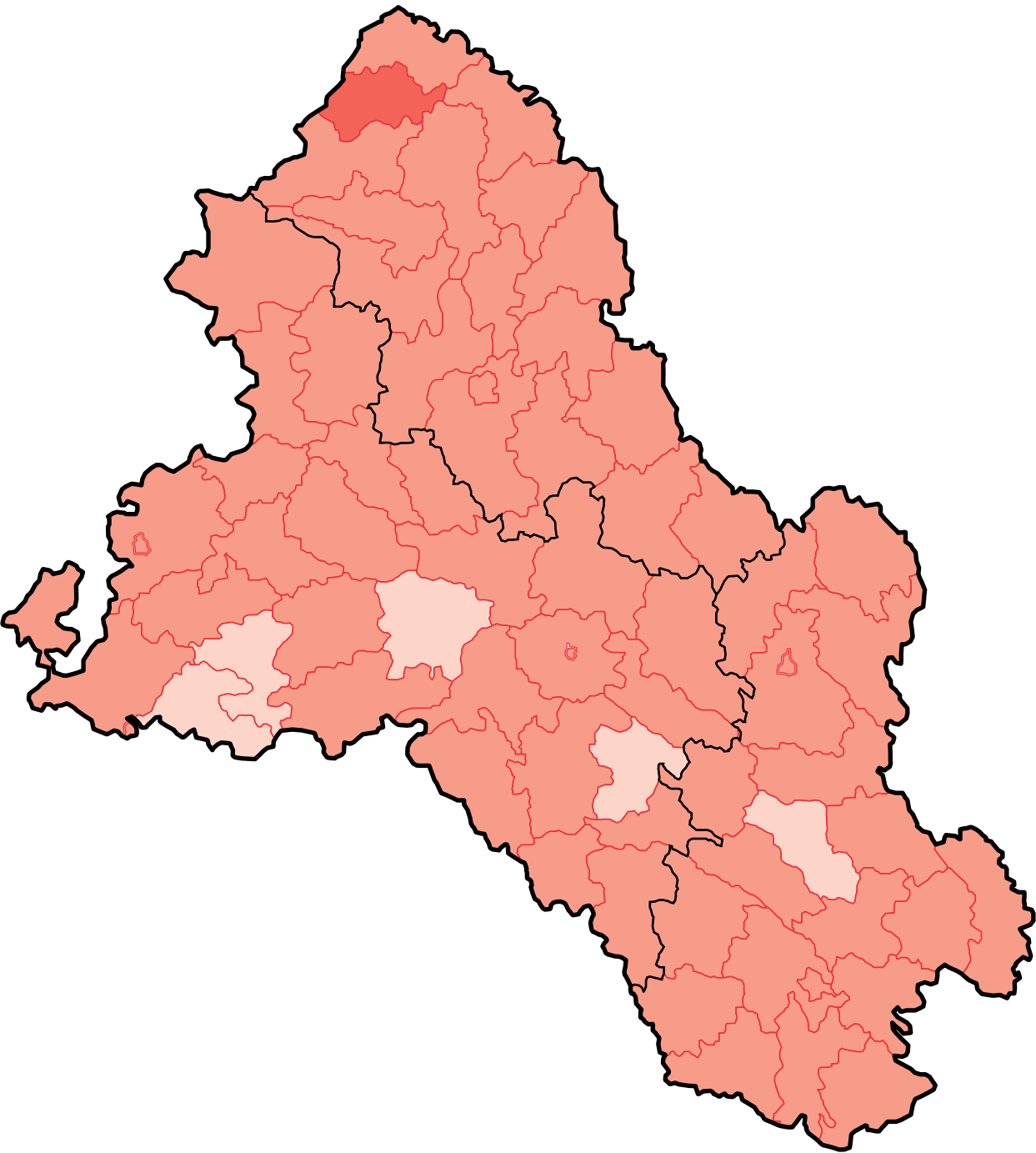

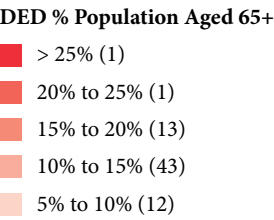

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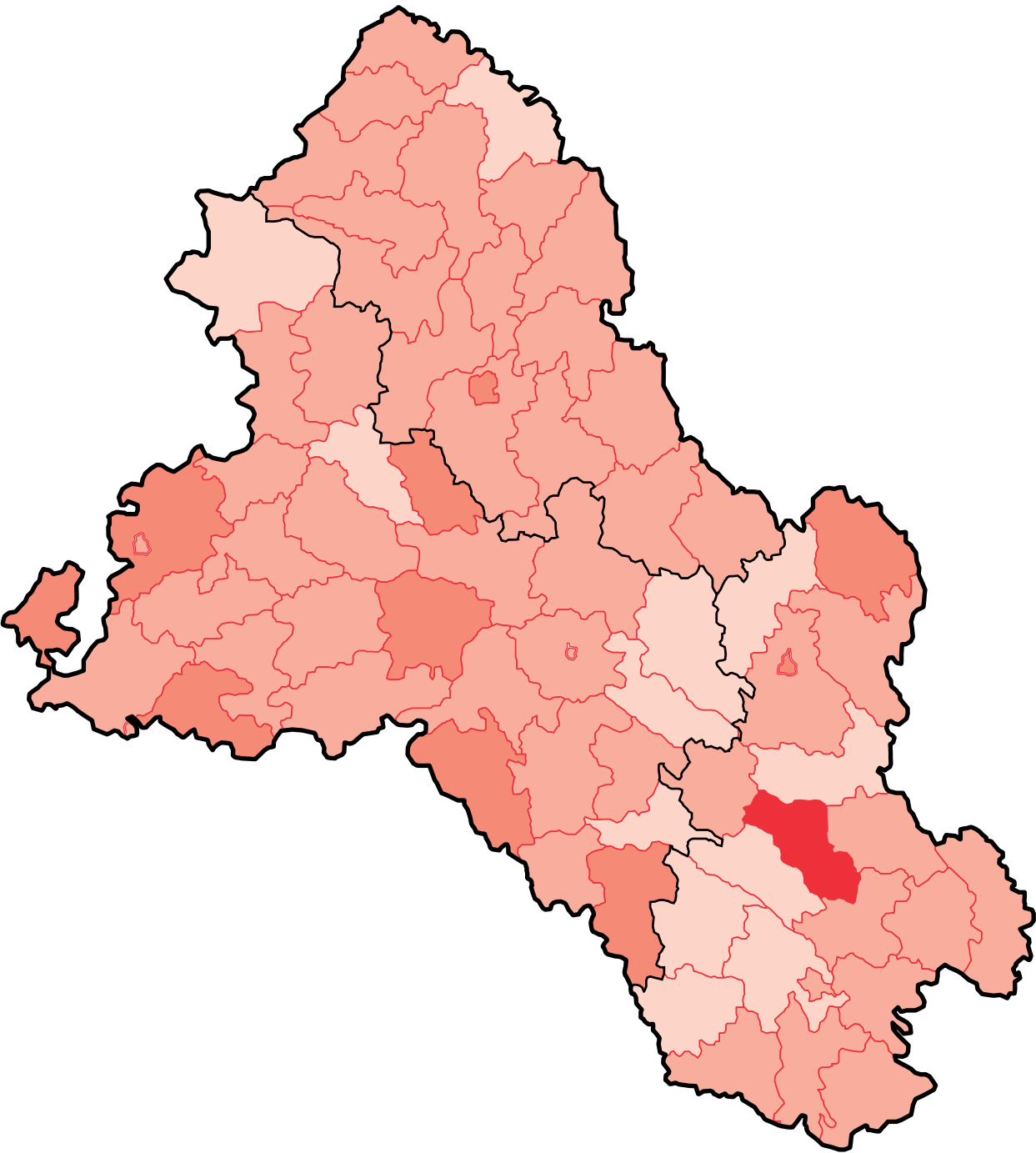

Gender profile of County Monaghan

In 2011 the population of County Monaghan was 60,483, consisting of 30,441 males and 30,042 females. This is a reverse of the pattern recorded in 2006 where there were slightly more females than males. The gender profile of the population of Monaghan follows the national trend, for all age profiles from 0-64 the gender ratio is relatively even.

The life expectancy for a woman in Ireland is 83 and for a man 78, this is reflected in the gender profile in County Monaghan where from the age bracket 65-69 onwards women increasingly outnumber men. The Table below outlines the gender profile within the 65+ age profiles within the county.

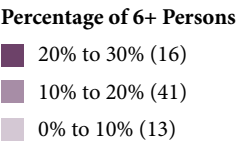

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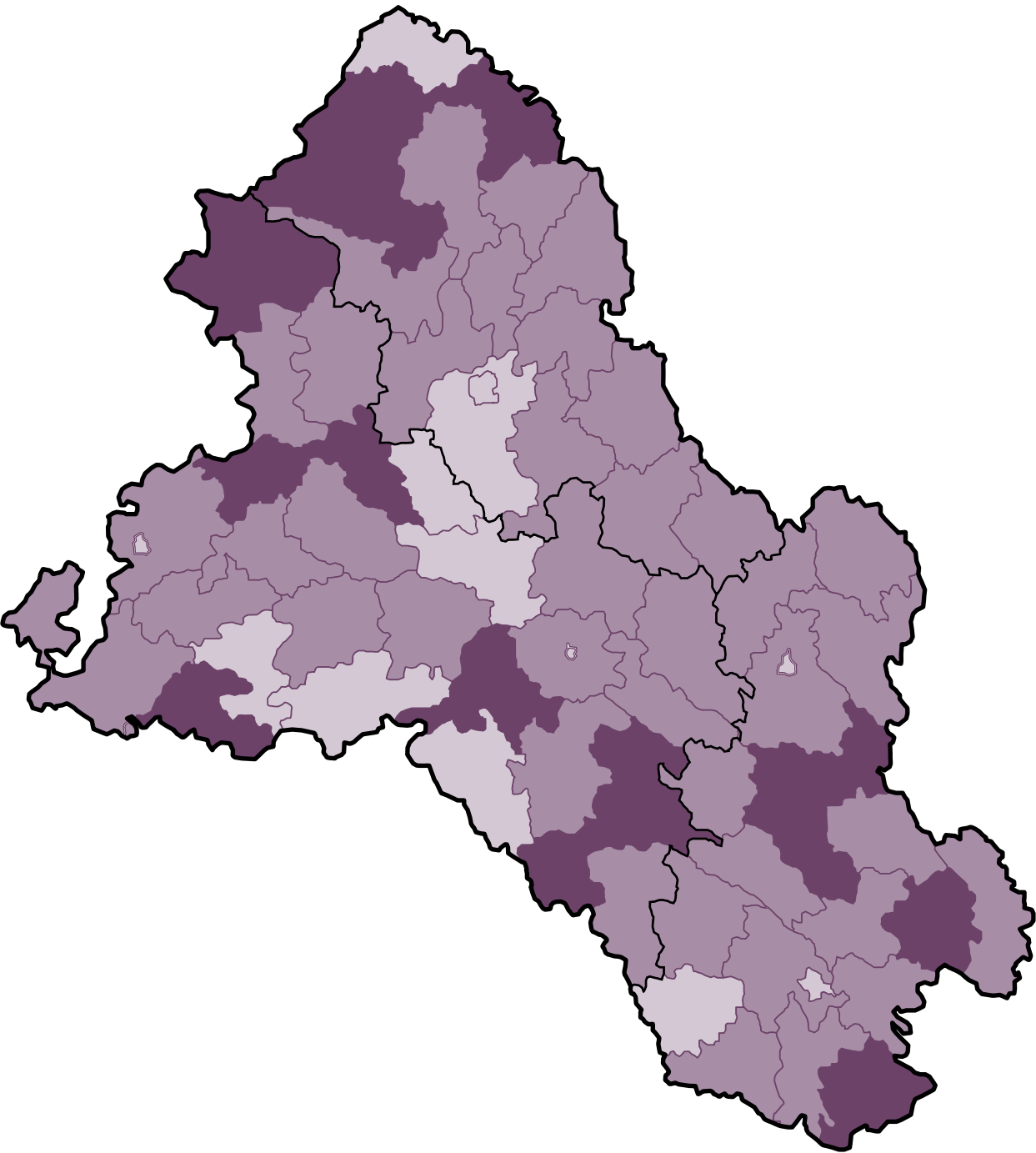

Education Profile

Education for the purposes of this profile is categorised into four stages

- Early education – delivered through the government free pre-school scheme.
- Primary education
- Post primary education
- Higher education/third level

In 2011, 5,076 persons in county Monaghan aged over 15 were still in education representing 70% of this population, which is higher than the national figure of 68%. 39,720 persons had ceased education.

Over 40% of the population who have ceased education left the education system before reaching leaving certificate level. The population distribution within educational attainment follows a similar pattern across all three Municipal districts. This chapter sets out the most recent data with regard to the educational attainment of the population of county Monaghan.

The chapter also includes data on the population of the county currently in the education system. Monaghan has 66 primary schools. There are 12 second level schools and 1 institute of higher education. In addition there are 59 childcare services contracted to deliver the free pre-school year.

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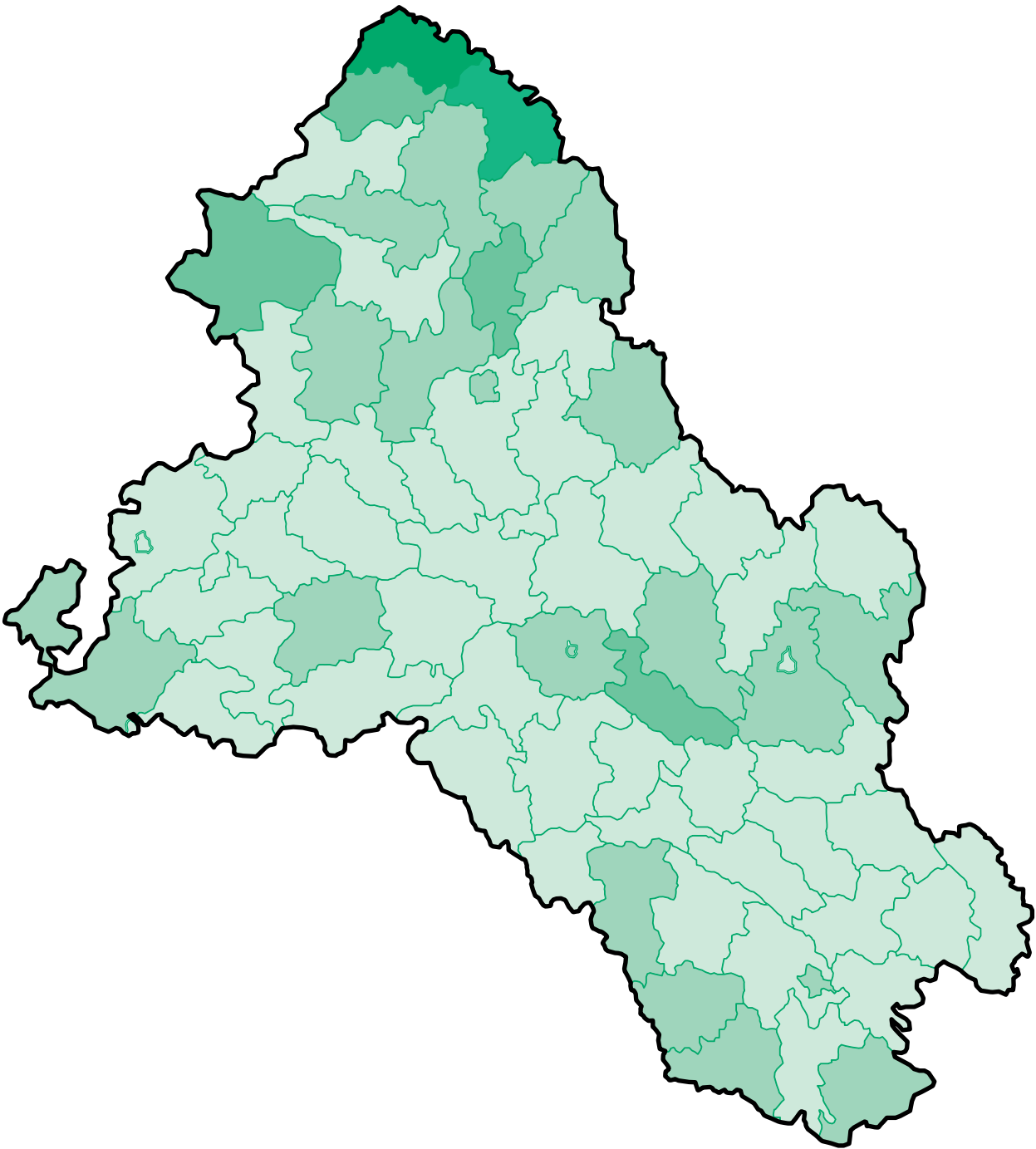

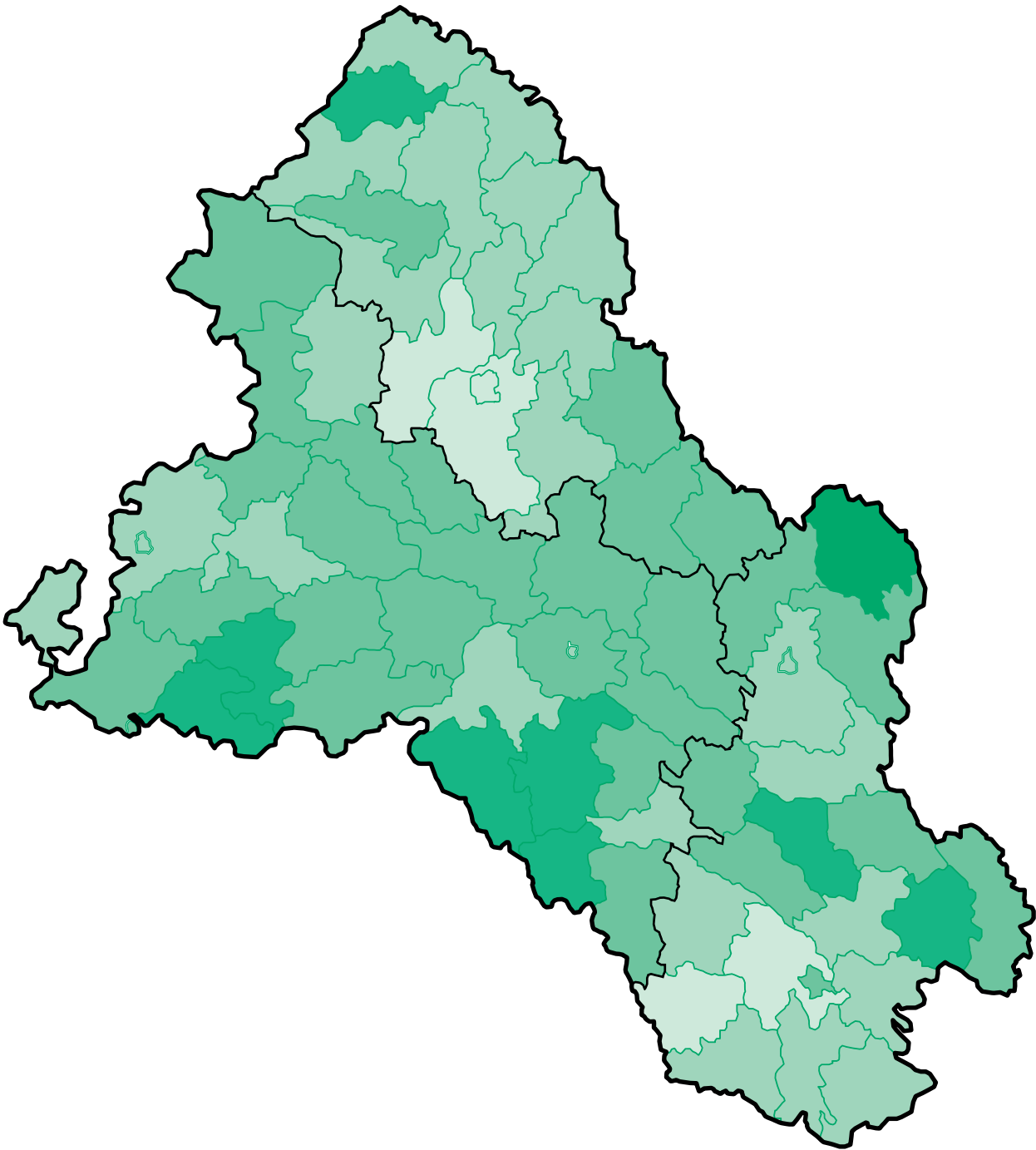

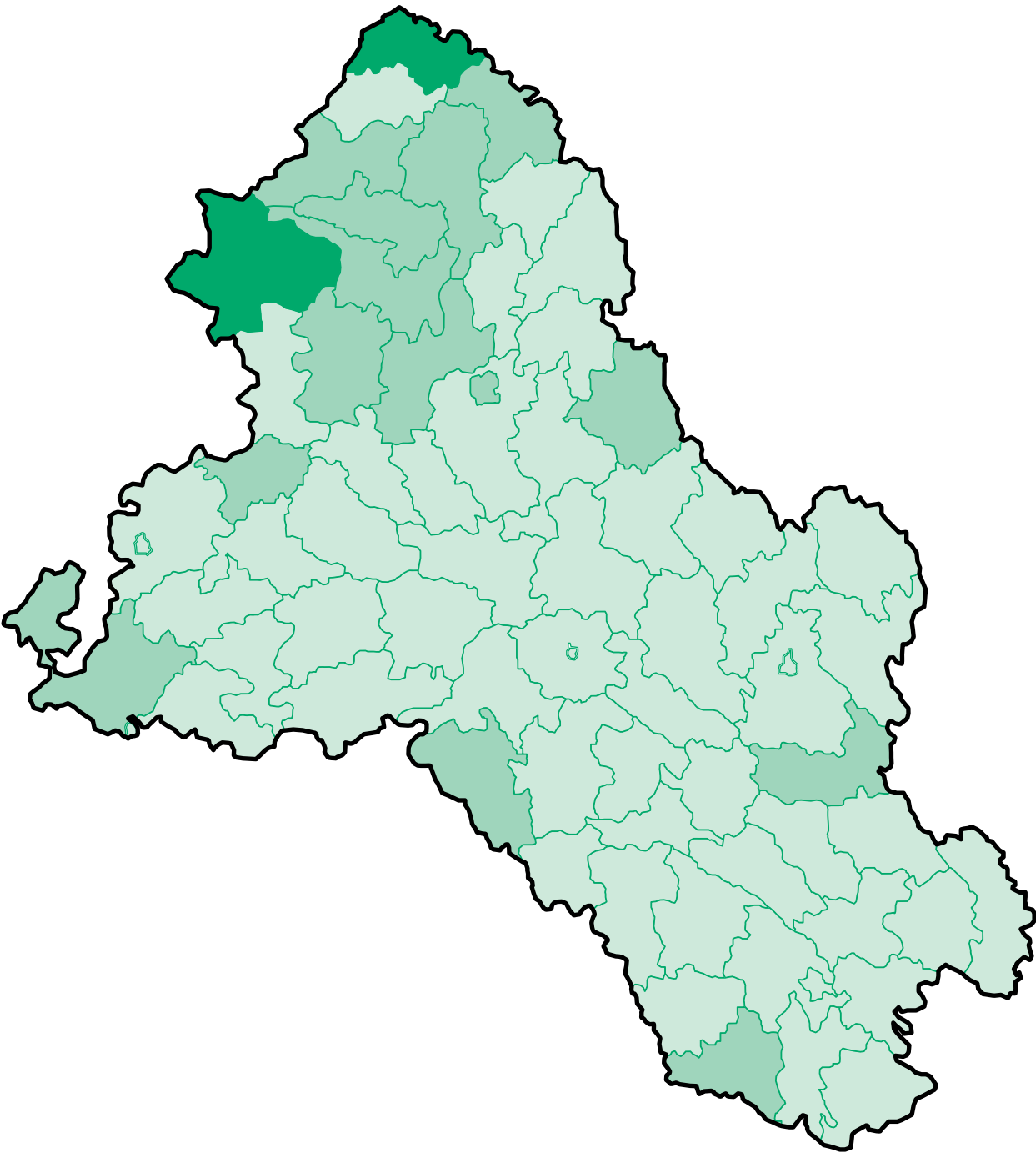

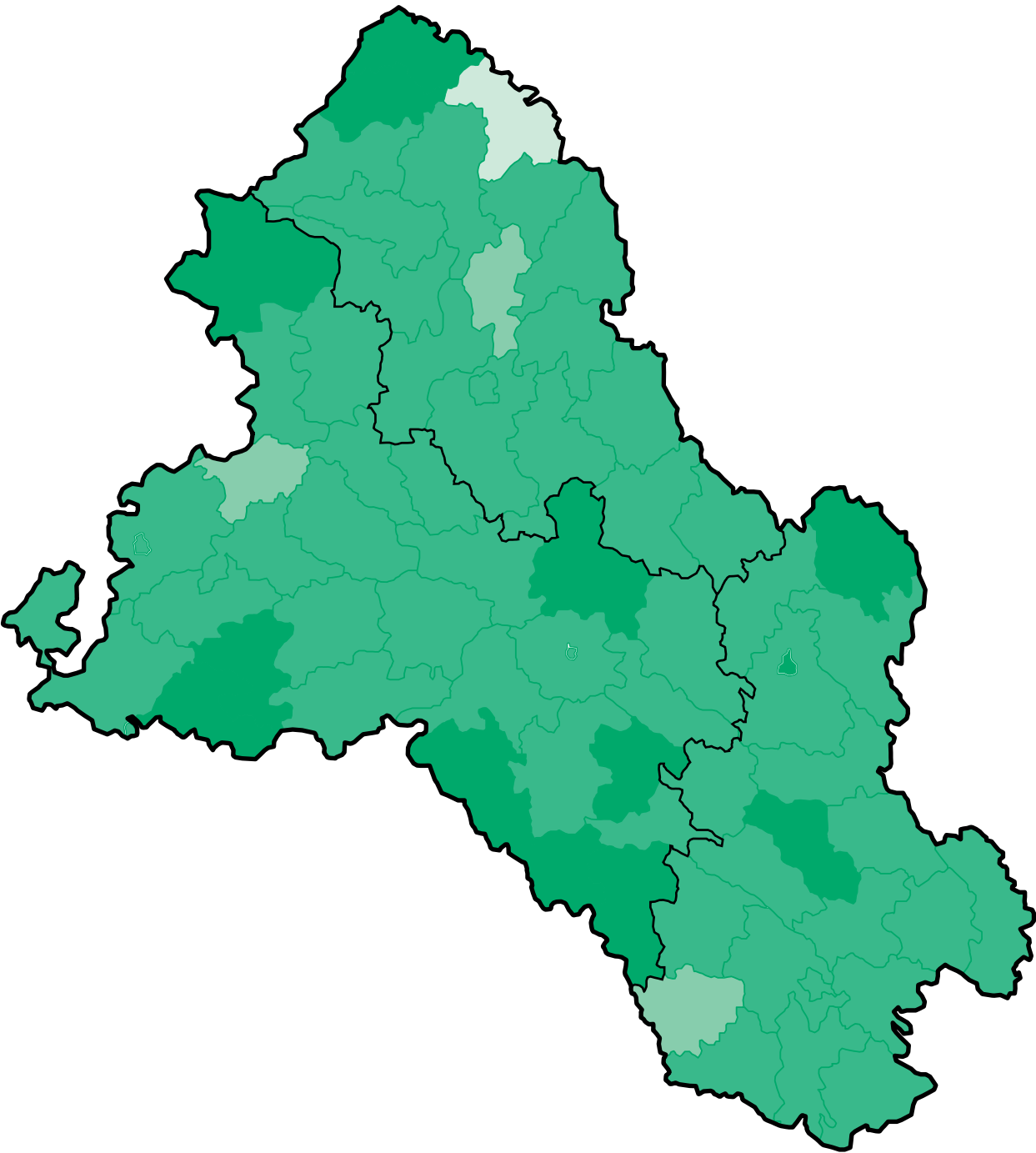

The Higher education authority (HEA) record the non progression rate of students each year who don't progress from first year to second year. This is recorded as the non progression rate. In 2013 the progression rate was 16%, recording that 84 % of all students who enrolled in first year in 2012 progressed into second year for the 2013/14 academic year. Employment

The economic downturn impacted heavily in county Monaghan. The unemployment rate in the county rose from 1,717 persons in 2006 to 5511 in 2011. Representing an increase the unemployment rate from 7.7% in 2006 to 19% in 2011. This chapter focuses on the profile of the population who were in employment at the time of the 2011 census. This socio economic profile refers often to the labour force of the population.

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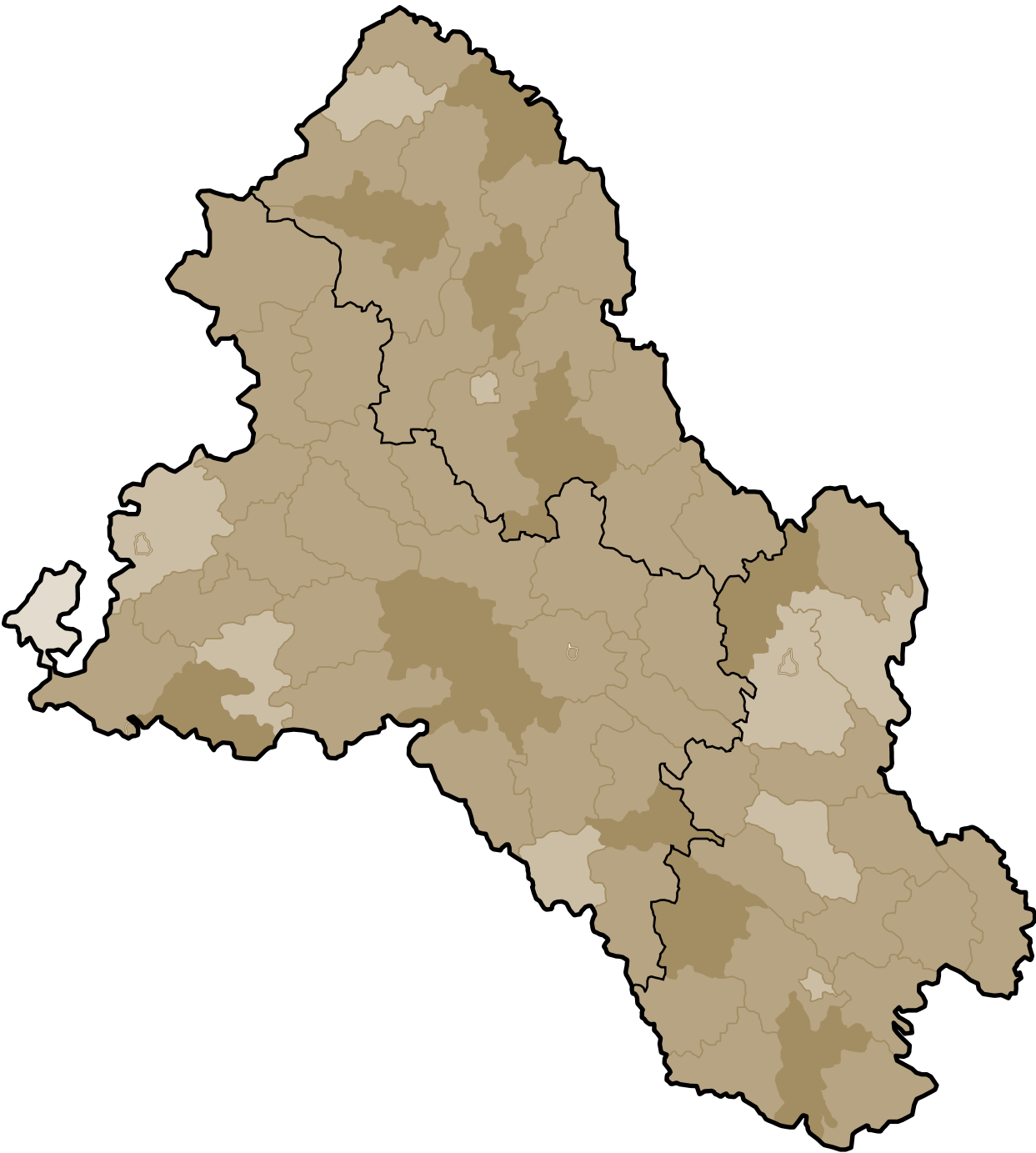

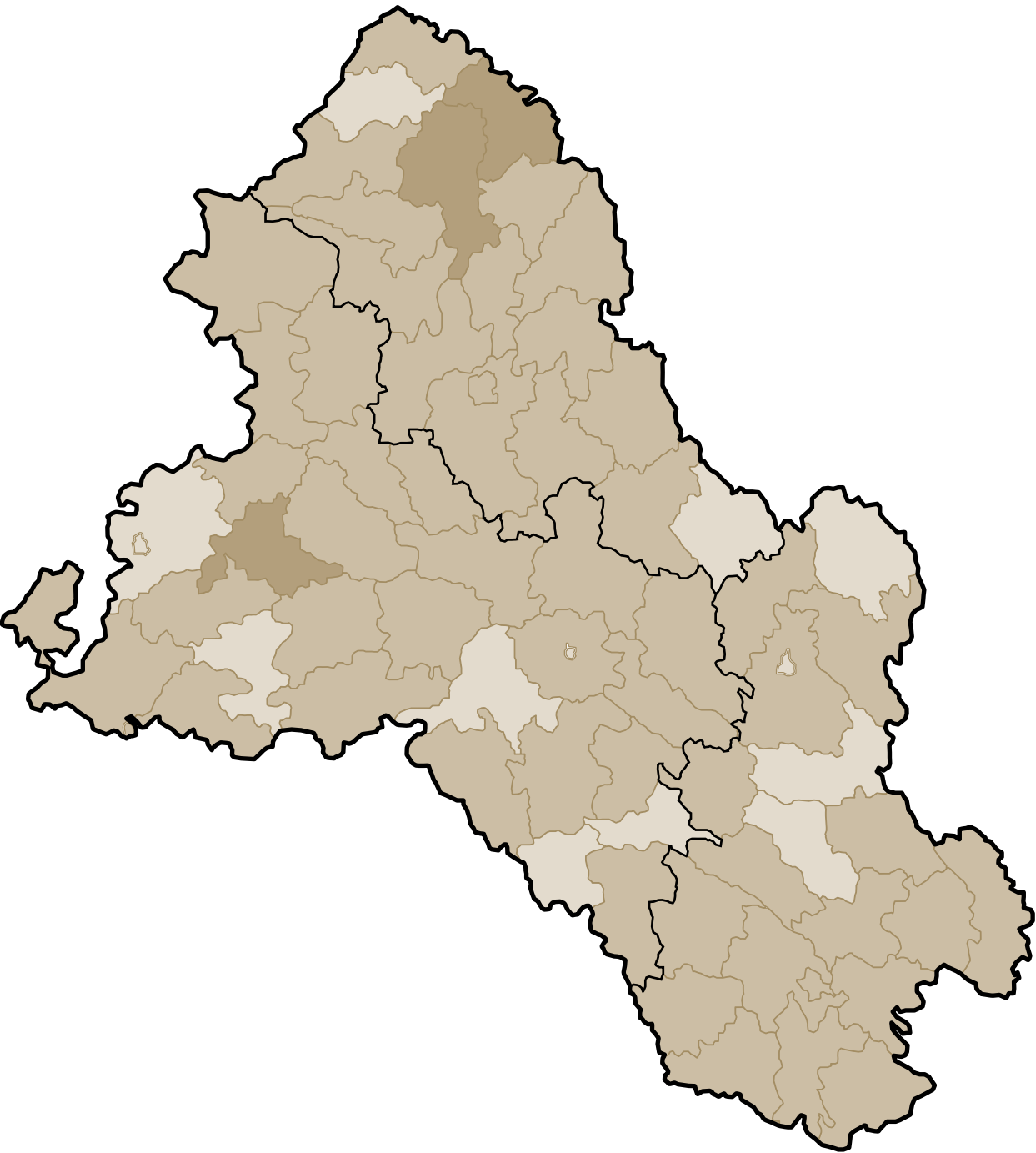

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Social class of employment

CSO data categorises the population into social groupings defined on the basis of occupation. Social class groupings in 2011 census were:

- 1. Professional workers
- 2. Managerial and Technical
- 3. Non manual
- 4. Skilled manual
- 5. Semi- skilled
- 6. Unskilled
- 7. All others gainfully occupied and unknown.

County Monaghan ranks high in the areas of managerial and technical and non manual social class groupings, and lower in the professional social class group.

There is no distinction in trend across the municipal districts with regard to social class. There are some differences however between male and female profiles under this category. A breakdown of the male/female by social class grouping within each DED is outlined below.

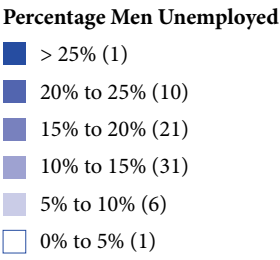
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Unemployment

Monaghan experienced significant rise in unemployment since a 2006 census. The 2006 census recorded an unemployment rate in the county of 7.5%. This figure had almost tripled to a rate of 19% by 2011. Almost 70% of those unemployed were male. Unemployment impacted heavily across all municipal districts, with Castleblaney/Carrickmacross recording the highest levels of unemployment in the county.

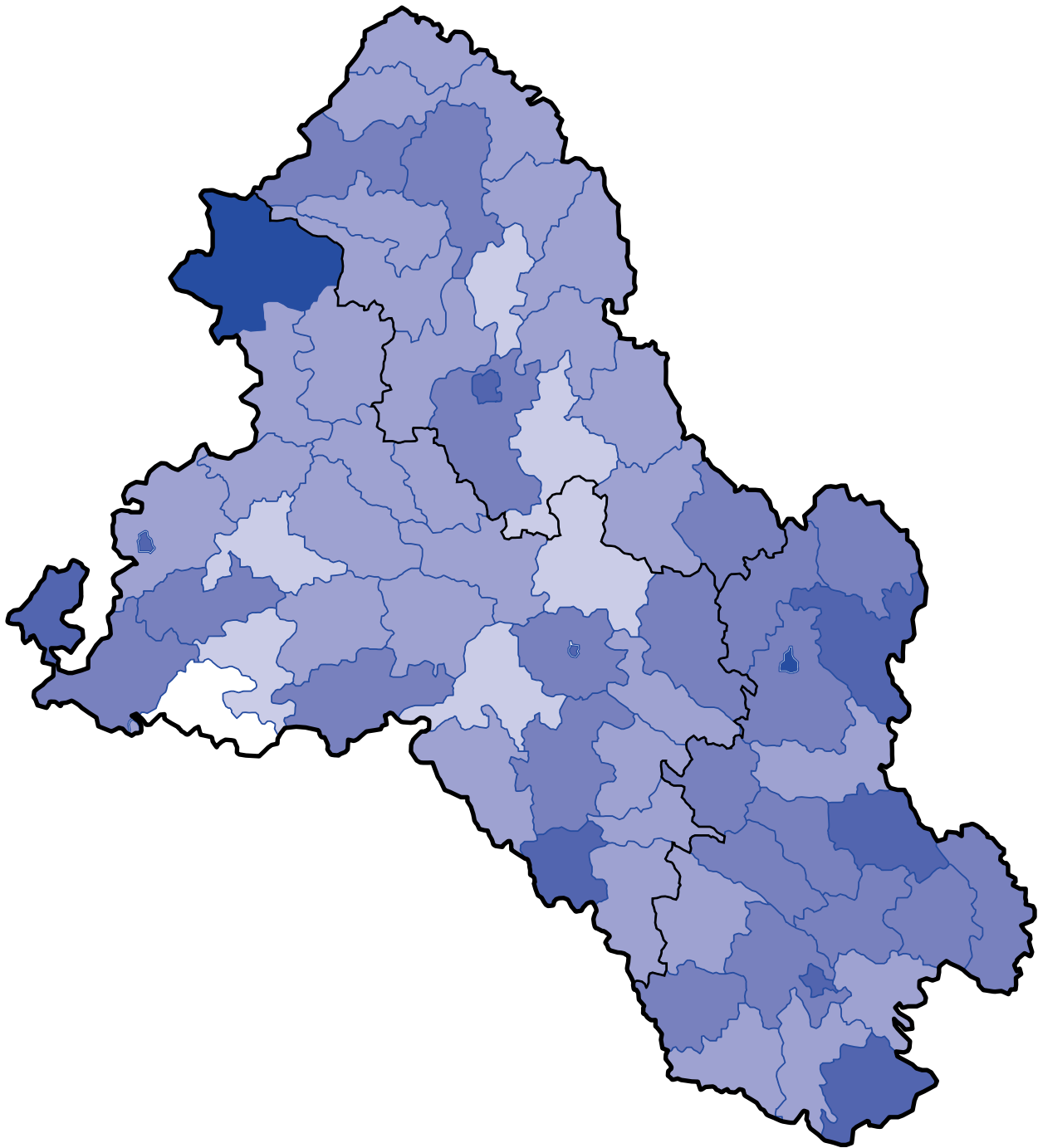
In 2014 the economy began to slowly recover which is reflected in the figures signing on the live register in 2014.

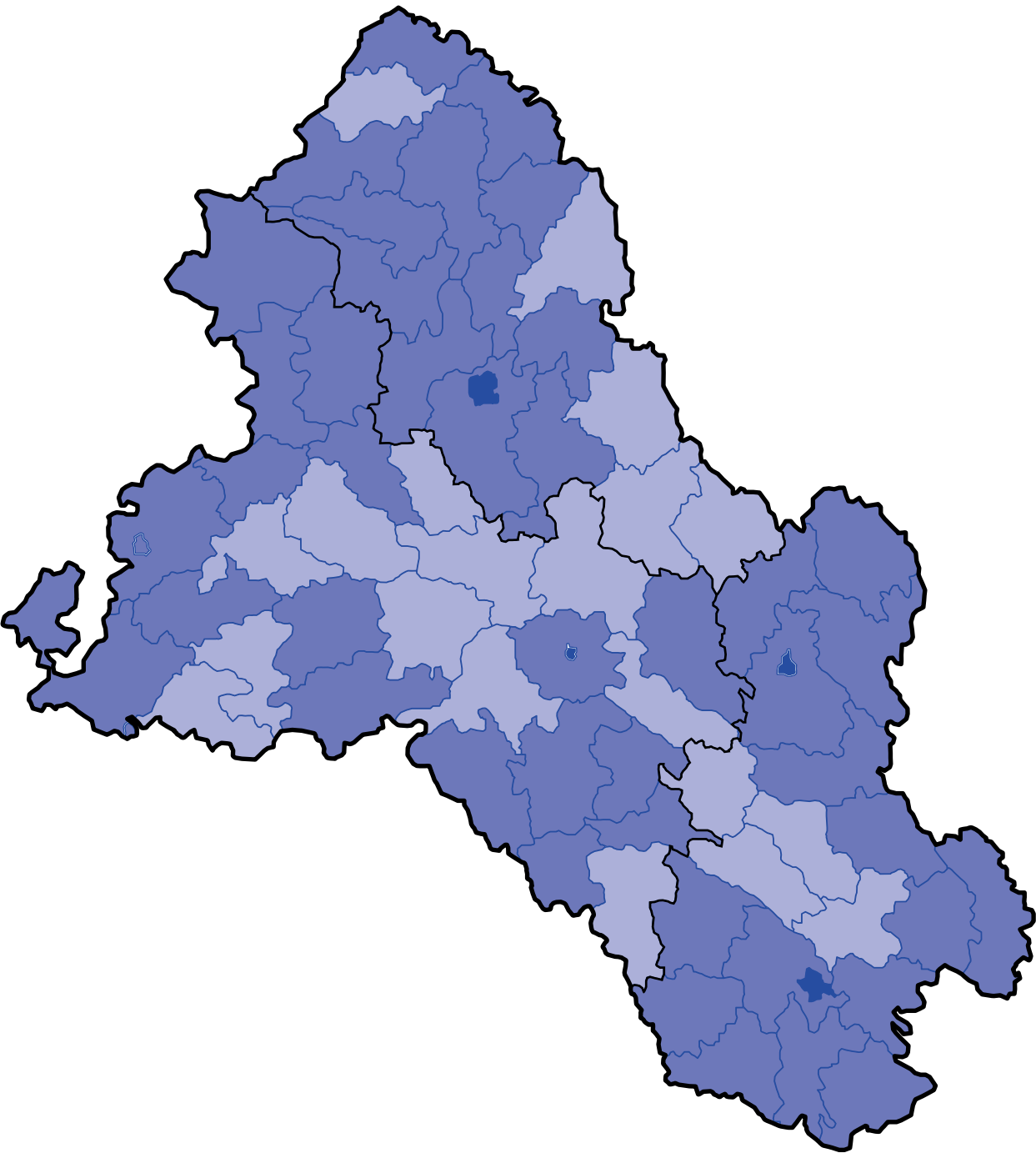

Persons with a disability

In 2011 7,174 persons were registered as having a disability in county Monaghan. Representing 12% of the overall population which is higher than the national figure of 10%.

The profile of people with a disability in county Monaghan records a significant proportion of people with a disability in the 65+ age category. 39% of all people with a disability in the county are over 65.

Refugees Asylum seekers and migrants

The make up of non Irish nationals in Ireland typically falls into three categories

Asylum seeker: is someone who is seeking to be recognised as a refugee. If they are granted this recognition they are declared a refugee. Asylum seekers in Ireland are placed into the direct provision system until a decision of their application is made.

Refugee: is any person who owing to well-founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group or political opinion is outside the country of his nationality and is unable or, owing to such fear, is unwilling to avail himself of the protection of that country” (United Nations Convention on Refugees, 1951)

A migrant worker is a person who is working in a state of which s/he is not a national. A migrant worker can be documented or undocumented.

The population of new communities in Ireland in 2011 accounted for 13% of the population. Polish was the most common nationality after Irish accounting for 3% of the population. In county Monaghan the non Irish national population accounted for 12% of the population, with Lithuanian being the most common nationality after Irish representing 4% of the county’s population, compared to a national figure of 1%. Monaghan municipal district has the largest percentage of non Irish nationals. Non-Irish nationals accounted for 29.4 per cent of the population of this area compared with a national average figure of 12.0 per cent, in particular Monaghan town and immediate surrounding areas. Smaller communities of non Irish nationals are located in Carrickmacross/Castleblaney municipal district, around the towns of Castleblaney and Carrickmacross.

St. Patricks Accommodation centre in Monaghan operates as a direct provision centre for persons seeking asylum. This centre has a capacity for 200 people; in October 2014 the centre had 165 residents.

Age Dependency ratio

The dependency ratio is the number of dependents in a of a population in ratio to the number of people in the workforce. People in the (0-14) and (65+) age categories are classed as dependents. The youth dependency ratio records the % of people aged 0-14 in ratio to the workforce (non dependent) population. The workforce is typically defined as the 15-64 age groups. In 2011 the youth dependency ratio in Ireland was 31% and 34% in Monaghan.The old dependency ratio relates to the % of the population aged 65 and older in ratio to the workforce.

In 2011 the old dependency ratio for the country was 17%, and 19% in Monaghan. The table below outlines the dependency ratios for the county in 2011.

The overall dependency ratio for an area combines the youth dependency ratio and the older dependency ratio.

7.4 Absolute and relative deprivation

Haase and Pratschke developed an index that provides a single measure of the relative affluence and deprivation for an area. The deprivation scores range from -50 to 50, with -50 being the most deprived and 50 being extremely affluent. The Border Region is the most disadvantaged region of Ireland, and Monaghan is the second most deprived local authority area within this region.

Monaghan was hugely impacted by the economic downturn after 2007 this was reflected in a drop of 8.0, compared to a national drop of 6.5. This larger drop in the relative deprivation score means Monaghan has moved from 11th to 7th most disadvantage local authority area in Ireland.

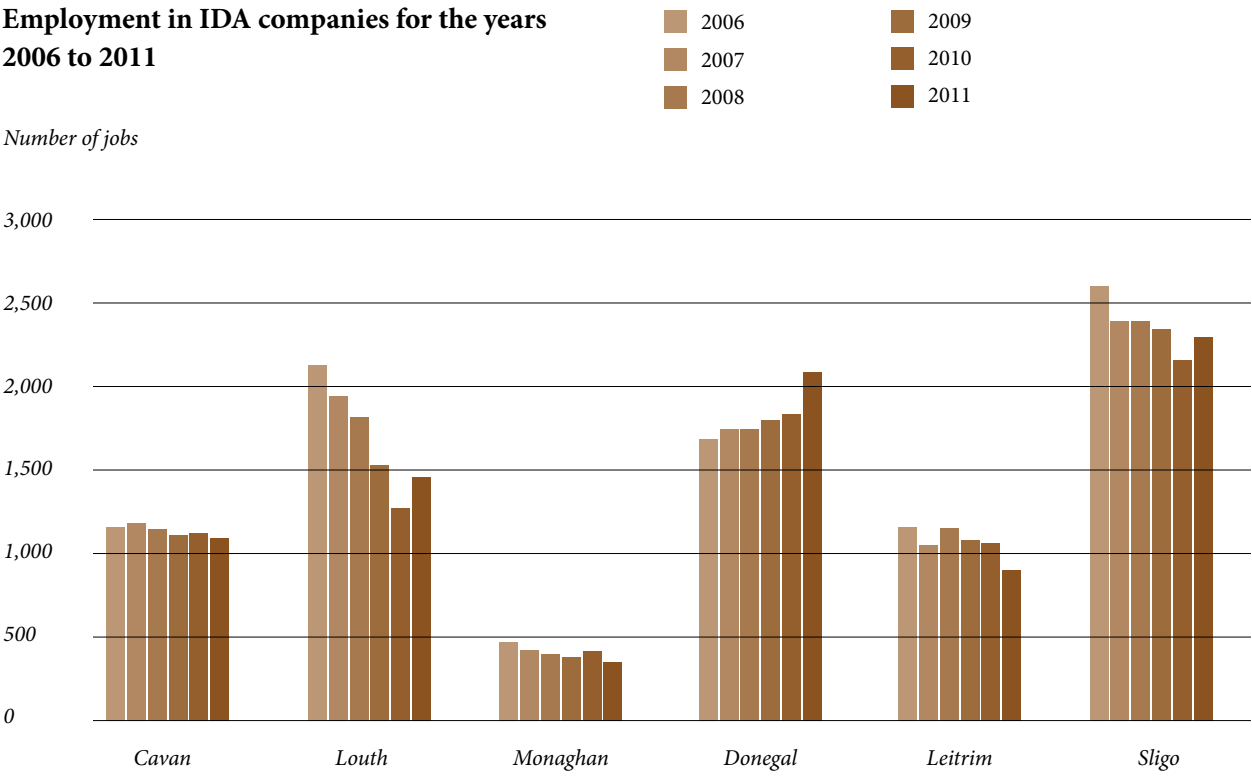
Enterprise

Government agencies provide a variety of employment supports to job creation through the Industrial Development Authority (IDA), Enterprise Ireland (EI) and the former County Enterprise Board (CEBs), now reformed under the local authorities as Local Enterprise Offices.

IDA

At December 2013, in County Monaghan there were 6 IDA supported companies employing 275 people in permanent positions and a further 73 in contract positions. In County Cavan, there were 5 IDA supported companies employing 1,020 people in permanent positions and a further 45 in contract positions.

It is clear that County Monaghan lags far behind all other counties in the Border Region for numbers employed in IDA client companies. In 2011, the figure was 355, compared to the next lowest of 903 in Leitrim and 1,104 in Cavan.

In 2004 there were 145 Enterprise Ireland assisted companies in the county employing circa 4,250, in 2013 there were 114 assisted companies employing almost 3,500 people. The sectors supported would have been predominantly food, engineering, consumer products and community enterprise centres.

Over €1.5m had been approved to Monaghan companies and €599,000 paid across EI’s suite of supports. At December 2013, in County Cavan, Enterprise Ireland had 99 client companies employing in excess of 4,000 people. Over €1m had been paid to Cavan-based companies by Enterprise Ireland.

The table demonstrates the variety of sectors supported by Enterprise Ireland with agri-food, engineering and furniture manufacturing featuring strongly.

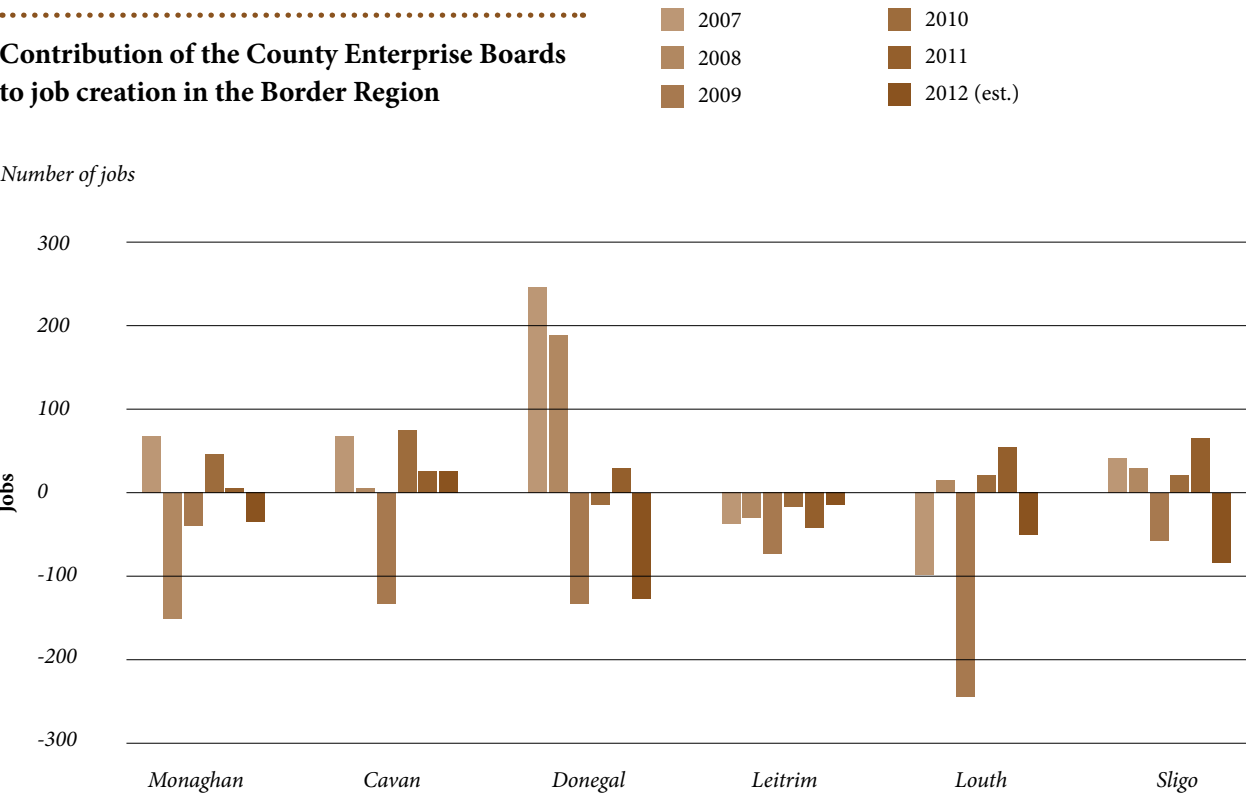

In 2012-2013, Monaghan County Enterprise Board approved grants to the value of €786,154 with 60.5 associated jobs, including €100,000 in 2012 towards the establishment of an Innovation centre in Carrickmacross. In addition the Board was involved in a number of cross-border projects with an estimated spend of €750,000. In County Cavan for the same period, the Enterprise Board had approved 18 grants to the value of €361,500.

9.3.3 Key points:

The figures for 2013 show a further fall in the number of people employed in IDA client companies for both Monaghan and Cavan. County Monaghan has more Enterprise Ireland client companies (124) than Cavan (99), however, Cavan have more employees, 4,000+ compared to approx. 3,500 in Monaghan. From 2006 to 2011 there has been a large fall in the numbers employed, from circa 4,250 to circa 3,500, in Enterprise Ireland supported companies. Monaghan’s County Enterprise Board approved a higher value of grants with more associated jobs than Cavan for 2012-2013.

Key points

The time period represents pre-recession activity (2002), recession and years following on from recession. The county’s gross industrial output has risen since 2009, by 8.6% for 2010 and by 14% between 2010 and 2011. Increases have also occurred in the net output from 2009 (30.1% from 2009 to 2010 and 21% from 2010 to 2011) which is indicative of improved profitability and reflects either cost reduction due to economies of scale, or a move towards higher ‘value-added’ products.

Although there has been an increase in outputs, the proportion of net output spent on wages and salaries has decreased, from 50.99% in 2009 to 33.85% in 2011, which is more akin to 2002 levels of 34.2%, although average wages have increased by 33% between 2002 and 2011.

9.4.4 Key points:

County Monaghan’s gross industrial output was much lower than Cavan’s, slightly higher than Louth’s and substantially higher than Leitrim’s. Although Leitrim’s gross output was substantially smaller than Monaghan’s, its net output less wages and salaries was slightly higher than Monaghan’s, which represents a higher margin of value added in Leitrim’s product. Louth’s net output less wages and salaries was substantially higher than Monaghan’s, again representing a higher margin of value added. There were substantial variations in average wages and salaries per employee, with Monaghan having the lowest, the State average was 49.8% higher, while Cavan’s was 25.7% higher. Monaghan had the highest figure for wages and salaries spent as a percentage of net output (37.85%) compared to the State average of 12.38%.

Key points:

For County Monaghan there has been little change in the number of units, yet there has been substantial change in the number of persons engaged, a reduction of almost 1,000. A similar situation has occurred in Cavan, with a reduction of 13 local units and reduction of just over 1,000 of persons engaged. Louth saw a decrease by 11 in the number of local units, with a reduction in persons engaged by 3,874. The State figures also reflect this pattern. Leitrim, however, saw an increase of local units by 9 and an increase in persons engaged by 18.

Agriculture

Agriculture is a dominant economic activity in County Monaghan, providing substantial employment at 12.25% in 2011, a much higher percentage than the regional and national figures of 7.72% and 5.06% respectively.

Farm Size

Monaghan farm sizes have traditionally been substantially smaller than the national average figures. According to the Census of Agriculture 2010, the average farm size in County Monaghan was 23.3 hectares which is substantially less than the national average of 32.7 hectares and below the regional average of 26.8 hectares.

Just over 50% (53.32%) of farms in Monaghan were less than 20 hectares in size in 2010, a slight decrease compared with 56.67% in 2000. In the State, 42.22% of farms in 2010 were less than 20 hectares, substantially lower than the Monaghan figure.

Only 7.97% of farms in Monaghan in 2010 are greater than 50 hectares in size, compared to the State figure of 18.2%.

Farm Type

County Monaghan's farming has traditionally focused predominantly on beef production with a lesser proportion involved in dairying. Detail of this is shown in the chart and table below.

The predominant farm type in County Monaghan is specialist beef production, representing 68.24% of farm types, which is significantly greater proportionally compared to Border and national figures of 56.92% and 55.58% respectively. Specialist beef production has increased by 8.44% since 2000.

Specialist dairying represents the second largest category, 13.12%, which is also greater proportionally than the Border and national figures. Specialist dairying has decreased by 10.81% since 2000. This trend is reflected nationally.

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Poultry

County Monaghanis the most significant county in the poultry industry representing more than half (53.53%) of the total birds in the State with 5,847,740, while the national figure is 10,924,807.

With a total of 350 farms in Monaghan, the average number of birds per farm is 16,708. The Border region has a total of 1,550 farms with an average number of birds per farm of 4,670, while the average number of birds per farm is 1,282 nationally.

The number of birds in the state has decreased both at national and county level from 2000, when there were 13,960,771 and 6,496,132 respectively. County Monaghan had increased its percentage share of total birds by 7% between 2000 and 2010, while the number of farms fell from 400 to 350.

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Characteristics of the holder

In general, farms tend to be family owned enterprises with a high percentage of the holders being in the older age groups. The table below demonstrates this.

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Pigs

As depicted from the table below, County Monaghan's contribution to the pig industry has fallen over the period 2000 to 2010, from 60 farms to 40 farms, and represented 1.62% of the number of pigs nationally in 2010, compared with County Cavan with 21.95% of the national figure, with 80 farms.

The data demonstrates a generally consistent pattern across the county, region and state. Large proportions of family farms are held in the older age groups. For 2010, Monaghan’s proportion of those in the under 35s at 7.86% was higher than the state and border average figures of 6.22% and 6.91% respectively. In Monaghan, the numbers in the under 35s category has almost halved from 2000 to 2010, while it has more than halved nationally. A comparison of the 2000 and 2010 figures also demonstrates an increase in numbers in the older age categories.

The data shows generally relatively small variations in economic sizes of farms between county, region and State, though Monaghan compares more favourably with the State figures than

the Border figures, with the Border having higher percentages in the lower economic sizes and lower percentages in the higher economic sizes. Many farm families depend on other means to support their traditional farm activities.

Key points

Having a look at the numbers of farms engaged and the variety of activities, it is important to note the contribution of these support employments and appreciate that they are sustaining the farming industry locally. At a national scale, which is reflected regionally and locally, forestry provides the largest contribution, followed by agricultural contracting, however, Monaghan has a much higher percentage involved in agricultural contracting (24.67%) than the State (18.37%), and the Border (17.0%). Monaghan is under represented in farm tourism (5.26%) compared to the national figure of 8.08% and 8.71% in the Border region.

A similar pattern emerges with recreational activities and home crafts. Perhaps this is reflective of the low contribution of tourism to the county. For 2000, the statistics have only classified four groupings of gainful non-agricultural activities. County Monaghan had a total of 97 farms engaging in gainful non-agricultural, broken down to 8 in farm tourism, 3 in recreational activities, 4 in home crafts, 24 in forestry and 62 in others. The 2010 figures represent a substantial increase in those gaining income from non-agricultural activities.

Tourism

Tourism has the potential to make significant contributions to the economy, with over 6.5 million overseas visitors to Ireland in 2012. County Monaghan is located in the North West region along with counties Cavan, Donegal, Leitrim and Sligo. The tables below look at the number of visitors received by the North West and their contribution to the economy.

11.2.2 Key points

County Monaghan received approx. 46,000 visitors in 2012, the second lowest figure for the North West region. The largest proportion of visitors is from Britain, approx. 32,000 visitors. The contribution to the economy is estimated at €11m, slightly ahead of Leitrim at €10m. The contribution of overseas visitors to Monaghan is much less than neighboring counties .

However, a more comparable county of Cavan, in terms of size, population, inland, border county, the contribution to the economy of overseas visitors to Cavan is double that of Monaghan at €22m. With regard to the 2009 data it is reflective of the effect of global economic turmoil, particularly in respect of visitors from Mainland Europe and North America. It may be of significance to note that the contribution of visitors from Northern Ireland is not included.

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Infrastructure

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Infrastructure (including transport, telecommunications, energy, water, serviced sites and industrial space) is crucial to retaining and attracting investment. The rural and dispersed nature of the county places additional pressure on the provision of key infrastructure.

Transport

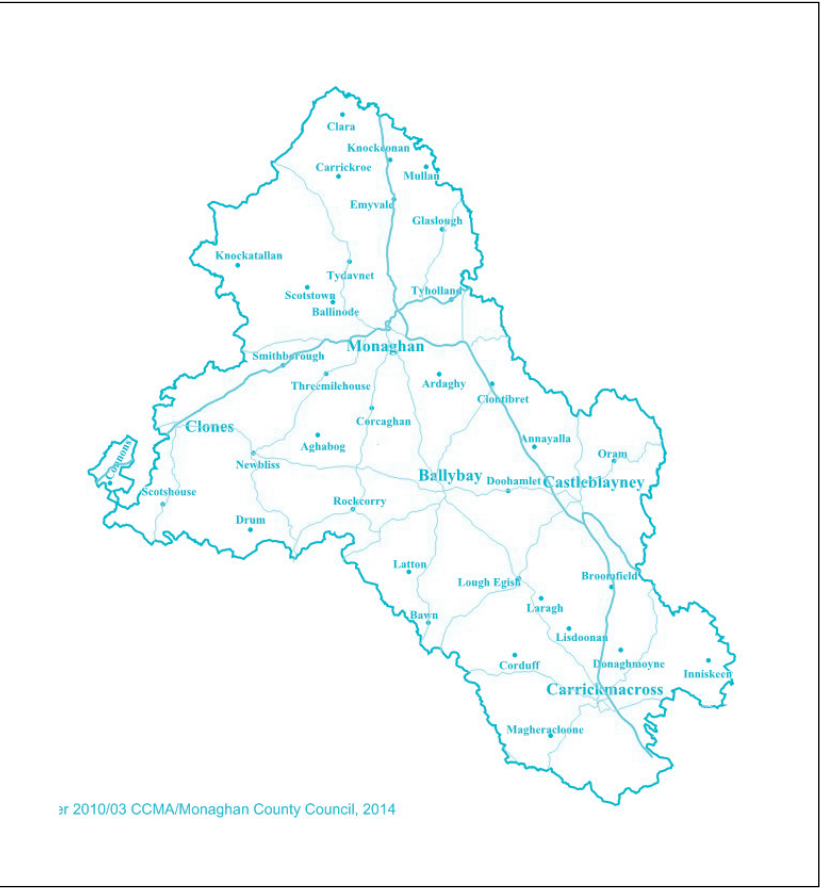
Road provides the main transport mode for the county. Upgrading of the national road network in recent years has reduced travel times to main cities and towns. The N2 is part of the strategic north-western radial corridor linking to the M1 to provide quicker journey times between Dublin and Derry/

Letterkenny. Monaghan’s national routes (N2, N12, N53 and N54) provide convenient journey times to the two main cities of Dublin and Belfast, along with the major gateways of Dundalk, Galway, Sligo and Letterkenny. A well maintained Regional road network in the county provides good linkages between the towns in the county and other provincial towns.

Public Transport

Public transport plays a key role in sustaining the vitality and viability of rural communities as well as providing essential inter-urban links. Towns and villages along the N2 National Primary Route are served by public bus operators on the Dublin to Letterkenny / Derry route along with private companies operating the Letterkenny- Monaghan-Dublin route.

Bus Eireann operates seven bus routes that service the county serving the main towns and villages in the county (table below). County Monaghan has good links to Dublin and Belfast International Airports, with towns in the county being accessible to an International airport in just over an hour and to port in just over half an hour.

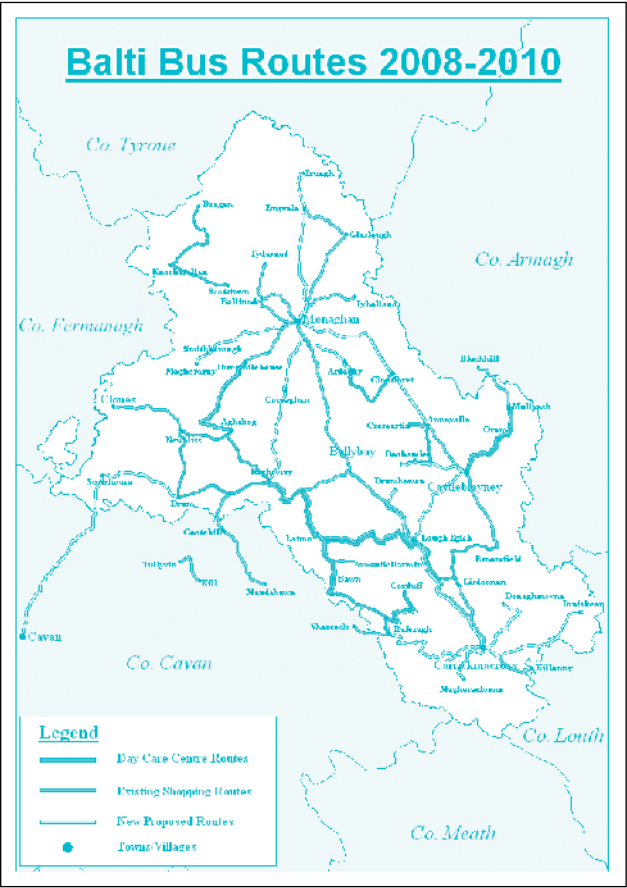

Rural Transport programme

The Rural Transport programme, funded through Pobal, was launched in 2007 “to provide a quality nationwide community based public transport system in rural Ireland which responds to local needs”. In County Monaghan, Bawn and Latton Social Services LTD (BALTIBUS) were contracted to deliver the RTP in the county.BALTIBUS provides numerous weekly routes to two key services points, transport to and from day care centres and to and from the main shopping towns in the county from surrounding rural villages and townlands. In April 2012, the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport assigned responsibility for managing the Rural Transport Programme (RTP) to the National Transport Authority in order to restructure the programme. The purpose of restructuring is to ensure a more efficient delivery structure that maximises integration with other State transport services and by making the Programme a sustainable part of the public transport system.

The restructuring involves establishing 18 Transport Co-ordination Units in place of the existing 35 Rural Transport Groups currently delivering services. As part of this restructuring process, Cavan and Monaghan were merged to form one Transport co-ordination Unit, this unit which will be based in Cootehill, Cavan will co-ordinate rural transport services for both counties. It is envisaged the new rural transport programme for Cavan and Monaghan will begin operation in January 2015.

Private transport

Unsurprisingly, given its dispersed rural population and network of small towns and villages, car is the favoured mode of transport in the county. According to the Census 2011, Monaghan had a high rate of car ownership (85.9%) compared to the national figure of 82.4%.

Monaghan’s rate of car ownership is the third highest in the Border Region, with Leitrim and Cavan having rates of 86.6% and 86.2% respectively. The following table details the level of car ownership for the county, comparing to the Border and nationally.

Key points

The number of households with no car in the county has decreased from 15.97% in 2006 to 14.07% in 2011. The decrease in households with no car is reflected regionally and nationally, although they have higher levels of no car ownership. The percentage of households with more than one car is higher in County Monaghan than in the Border Region and nationally.

The dependency on car ownership is reflective of the absence of rail infrastructure in the county and the poor level of bus service. 0.23% of people travel to work in County Monaghan by bus (a total of 219 persons) compared to an average of 3.6% across the Border Region, Monaghan’s is the second lowest level in the Region, behind County Leitrim (0.08%). According to the Census 2011, 30 persons in the county travelled to work by rail (0.05%). With no rail infrastructure, these commuters would have to travel to the nearest rail station in adjoining counties. The average figure across the Border Region was 2.16%. Along with mode of transport, it is important to assess how long people spending commuting.

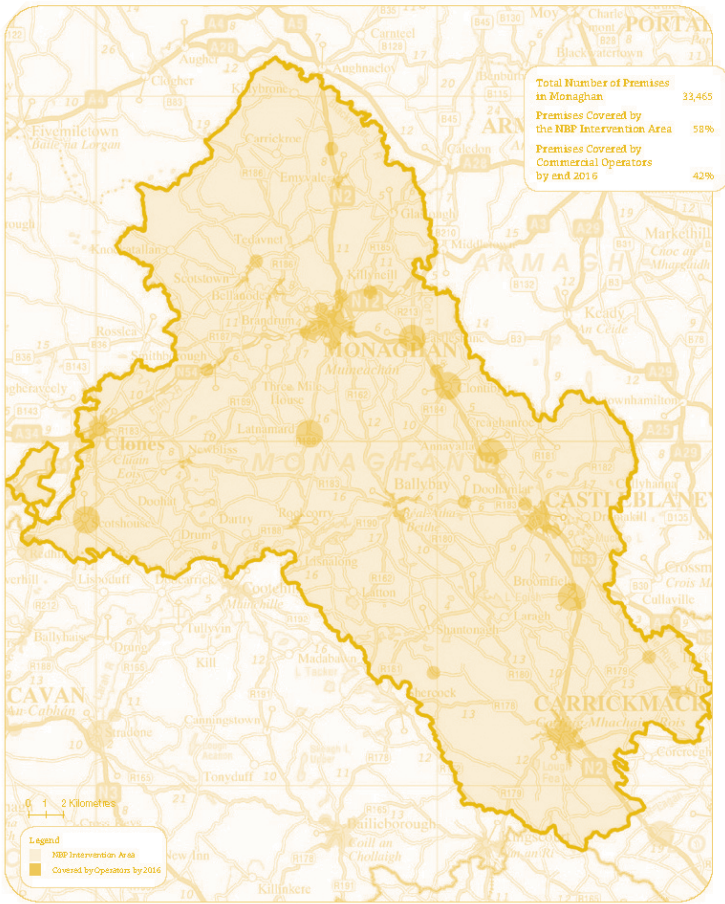
Telecommunications

From 2006 to 2011 there has been a large increase nationally in the availability of access to the internet. The county figure for access to broadband rose from 10.21% in 2006 to 53.62% in 2011. However, there remain significant regional deviations, in County Monaghan those households with no access to the internet is 34.19%, compared to regional and national figures of 31.91% and 25.83%, respectively.

Broadband is critical to the future development of business in the county. The four towns of Monaghan, Carrickmacross, Castleblayney and Clones are served by Metropolitan Area Networks (MANs).

To compliment this, the county has a variety of other broadband options including Eircom’s eFibre superfast fibre broadband that delivers speeds of up to 100Mb. The eFibre is currently available in the towns of Monaghan, Carrickmacross, Castleblayney and Clones, while it is due to launch in Ballybay and wider areas of the county from April to June 2015.

Eircom’s NGN to wireless solutions is offered by a number of operators. Rural areas of the county are covered by ‘3’ under the National Broadband Scheme.

Under the Schools Broadband 100 MBS Project, all post-primary schools in the county have had 100 MBS broadband installed in 2102.

ESB Telecoms provides a national trunk fibre optic network which is located in the south of the county.



Earnings/disposable income

The rate of disposable income gives an indication of the prosperity of the county.

Project Kelvin provides capacity and the ability to directly and securely connect to Canada, US, UK and mainland Europe. Project Kelvin offers clients dedicated Ethernet at all speeds, including 10G LanPhy, which allows for 10.3125 gigabits of capacity. The cable links Armagh, Ballymena, Belfast, Coleraine, Derry, Omagh, Portadown and Strabane to Europe and North America. In addition, the cable also provides for links to Letterkenny, Castleblayney, Dundalk, Drogheda and Monaghan.



Power infrastructure

Monaghan’s electricity supply is backboned by the existing 110kV network which is fed from 220kV bulk supply points at Flagford 220kV station and Louth 220kV station (located near Louth village).

Eirgrid’s proposed Meath-Tyrone 400kV Interconnection Development is required to improve competition by increasing transfer capacity between the two systems, thereby reducing transmission constraints that are currently restricting the efficient performance of the All-Island Single Electricity Market.

Natural Gas is currently piped to Carrickmacross and Lough Egish.

Key points

In 2011 the estimate of disposable income per person in the county was €16,261, the second lowest in the country behind Donegal at €15,897, with a State average of €19,055. Monaghan’s level of disposable income has decreased year on year since a peak in 2008 at €19,928. Looking at the indices of disposable

income, the Border Region lags well behind the rest of the country, although it has improved somewhat from a figure of 86.5 in 2002 to 89.1 in 2011. At a county level, Monaghan had made some gains around the boom years, with a figure of 93.6 in 2005, but has since fallen to 85.3 in 2011, representing less disposable income than the Border region average.

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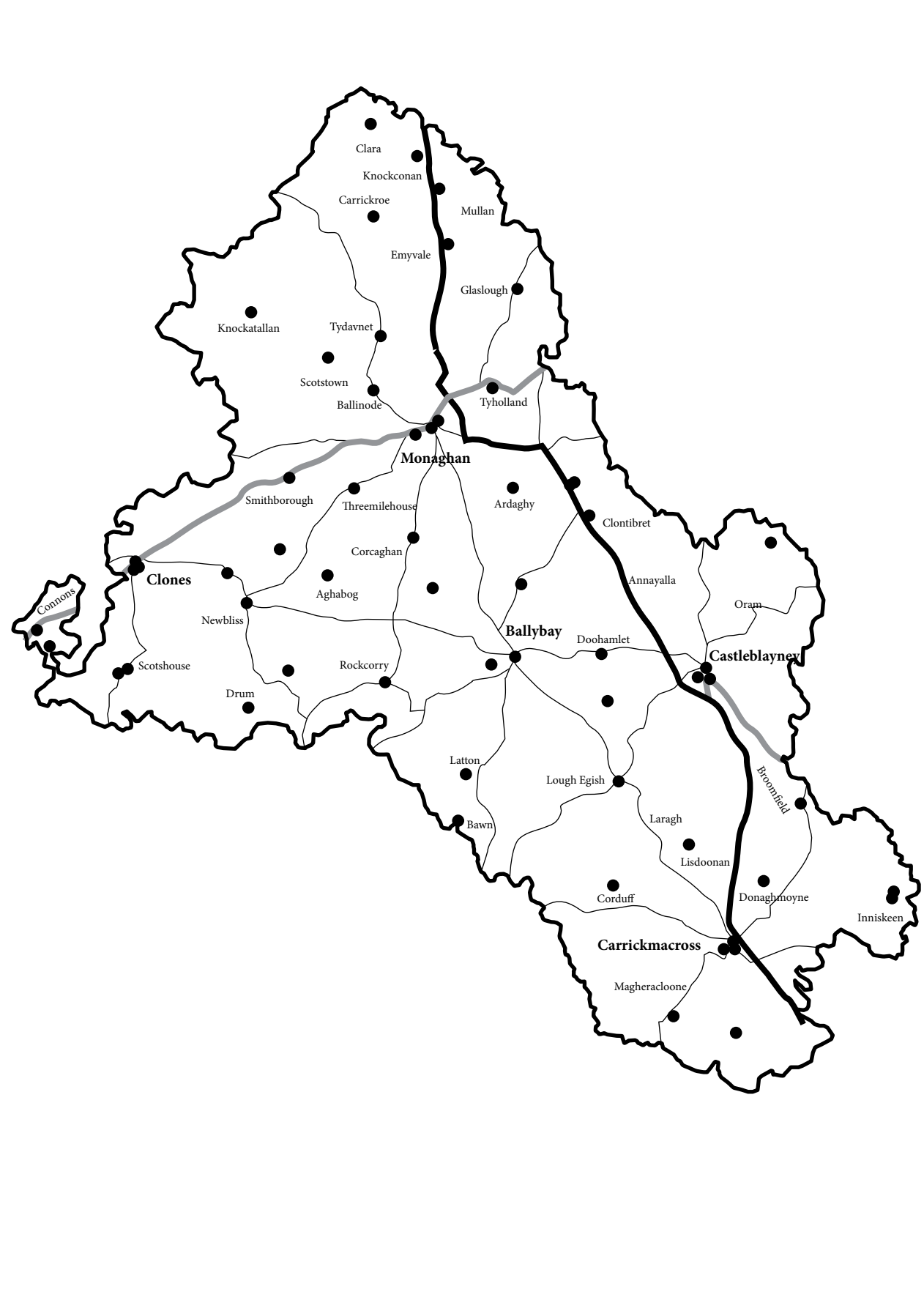

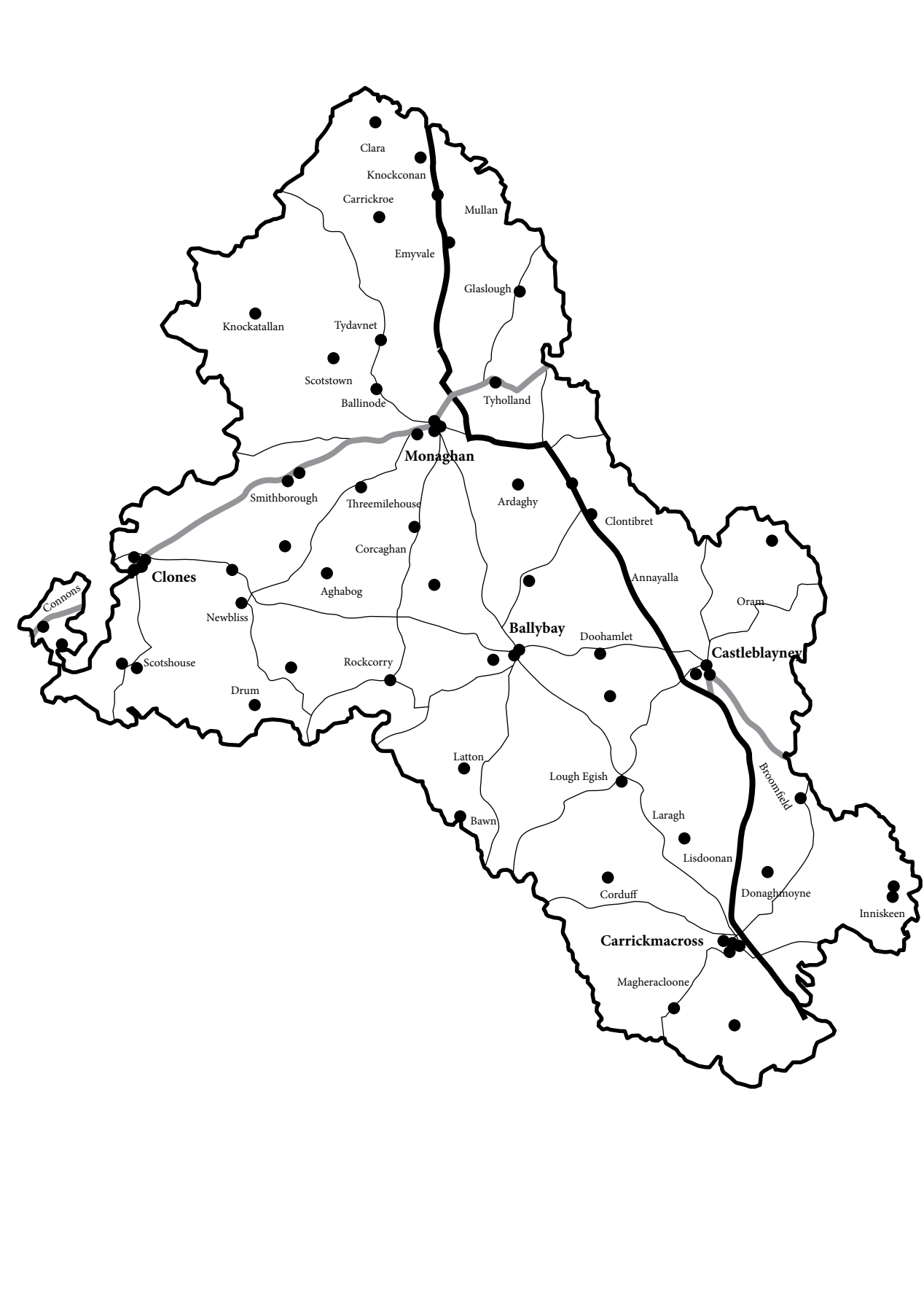

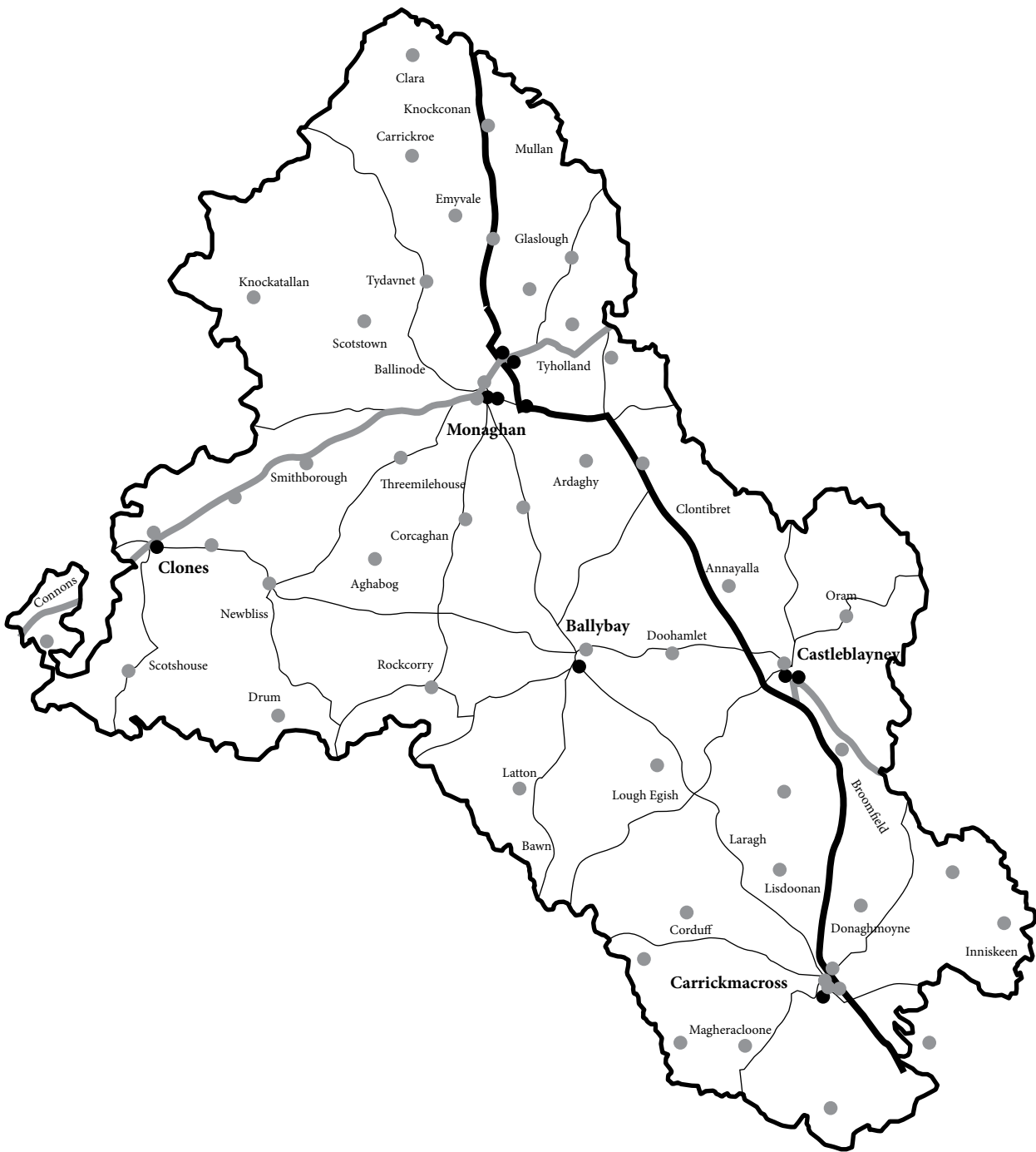
