# **Mission Statement**

Monaghan Drugs and Alcohol Forum is committed to supporting an interagency approach in the delivery of information, supporting the coordination of services and delivery of strategic goals that aim to address, challenge and prevent the misuse of drugs and alcohol in County Monaghan.

Monaghan Drugs and Alcohol Forum will operate in a manner that is respectful, inclusive and fair to all its members and communities of County Monaghan.

### **Background to Monaghan Drugs and Alcohol Forum**

### Introduction

Monaghan Drugs and Alcohol Forum was established to identify the key issues in County Monaghan with regard to drugs and alcohol misuse and to identify possible solutions to identified issues using collaborative action. During the development of Monaghan Local Econonomic and Community Plan 2016-2021, the issue of substance misuse was raised on numerous occasions. A research commissioned by Teach na Daoine Family Resource Centre – *A Community* based study of synthetic cannabinoid use in County Monaghan also raised a number of issues and concerns in relation to the problematic use of drugs and alcohol within the community. Subsequently, the establishment of a Drugs and Alcohol Forum was included as an action in Monaghan Local Economic and Community Plan 2016-2021.

### Monaghan Local Economic and Community Plan 2016-2021:

Strategic objective 5.3	To improve and sustain the health and wellbeing of all people in County Monaghan
Action: 5.3.3	Establish a Drugs and Alcohol Forum for County Monaghan

Monaghan County Council coordinated an interagency steering committee that organised a community wide consultation workshop the purpose of the workshop was to explore whether there was interest in establishing a county wide drugs and alcohol forum, and to agree on draft strategic actions that could be addressed by the forum. The consultation workshop took place in April 2016. Over fifty professional staff from a broad spectrum of local statutory, community and voluntary services attended the workshop.

This strategic plan outlines the core issues identified by participants at the consultation workshop and the strategic actions that the forum will progress in order to address these issues.

Referral routes in crisis services	Relationship and referral routes between acute hospital services, drug services and mental health services are not clearly defined. Acute services do not know where to signpost or to send young people when they present at A&E

Substance misuse among Ethnic Minorities	There is a lack of information and understanding of trends emerging in relation to drugs and alcohol use within the ethnic minority communities throughout the county
Addiction and Homelessness	There is a need to support pathways for people presenting as homeless resulting from addiction
Transitional housing	There are no supports in place in the region with regard to housing for people coming out of prison or residential care with a history of addiction
Opiate substitution	<ul> <li>The are currently no opiate substitute supports available in the county</li> <li>There is also no alternative to heroin substitute treatment options, other than methadone available in the county</li> </ul>
Misuse of prescription medication	There is need to explore and identify trends with regard to misuse of prescription medications in particular among the over 65 age group

Harm reduction	<ul> <li>There is a need for harm reduction initiatives in the county to support people who have developed dependency and addiction to drugs and alcohol</li> <li>Education on the wider aspects of addiction, substance misuse and mental health</li> </ul>
Support for the formal Education Sector	<ul> <li>There is a need for more awareness raising programmes and support for the formal education sector in recognising signs of substance misuse and addiction</li> <li>There is a need for targeted strategies on how to address substance misuse within the formal education sector</li> </ul>

### **Monaghan Drugs and Alcohol Forum Terms of Reference**

### Aim

To support the interagency sharing of information, co-ordination of services and implementation of solutions to substance misuse in County Monaghan.

### **Values**

The work of the forum is underpinned by the following values:

- The work is evidence based
- The approach is inclusive
- The focus is action orientated

### Membership

Any organisation with an interest in the area can request, through the Chair, to join the group, so long as they can commit to the terms of reference. The Forum can co-opt new members if they have relevant expertise.

### Member responsibilities

- Members need to commit to attendance at meetings
- If a substitute attends the meeting the member of the group should ensure they are briefed sufficiently to allow them to undertake tasks that may be assigned to them
- Members have a responsibility to undertake assigned tasks in the agreed time or to ensure that these are done

### **Role of Forum Member**

- To support the development of a strategic action plan for the forum
- To support the working groups to overcome challenges they face in achieving their priority actions
- To support communications throughout the Forum

### **Forum Working Groups**

Monaghan Drugs and Alcohol Forum will aim to deliver the actions of this strategy through four thematic working groups focusing on the following thematic areas:

- 1. Education, formal and informal
- 2. Research and Co-ordination
- 3. Training, awareness raising and development
- 4. Youth and young people (up to 25 yrs)

### Role of working groups

- Each working group will deliver related actions in line with the strategic plan
- Members will meet as often as they deem necessary
- Members will lend subject matter expertise in order to identify and progress actions
- Non Forum members may be invited to join a working group

### **Secretariat duties**

Secretariat duties and developmental support for the forum will be provided by Monaghan County Council, and will specifically include:

- Support the delivery of actions within the strategy
- Sending out notification of meetings
- Support reporting from the working groups to the steering group
- Writing and maintaining a record of meeting minutes
- Providing a venue
