



The danger in making it 'a tourist destination' would be that you'd have to address health & safety issues surrounding access to the site. I'd want to see as little interference as possible at the Scotshouse site, but would be happy to see a reconstruction of the ditch at a section where it has been destroyed to show what it looked like in its heyday. This reconstruction would be informed by the research to date and would present an opportunity for raising local awareness of their archaeological/heritage/cultural landscape.


Please indicate where you live in relation to Scotshouse?
