## **PART 1**

### **Preliminary**

**Long Title:** In exercise of the powers vested in it by the following legislation:

County of Monaghan Traffic and Parking Bye-laws, 1986 (S.I. No. 194/1986),

Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) Regulations, 1997 (S.I. 182 of 1997),

Road Traffic (Signs) Regulations, 1997 (S.I. No.181 of 1997),

Road Traffic Act, 1961 (as amended)

Ballybay Town Council hereby makes the following Bye-laws.

**Short Title:** 1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Ballybay Town Council Traffic and Parking Control Bye-laws

**Commencement:** 2. These Bye-laws shall come into operation on ??????

**Area of application:** 3. These Bye-laws apply to the area comprising that part of the Town of Ballybay as delineated on Map No.1. entitled 'Ballybay Traffic & Parking Bye-laws, 2008'

**Interpretation:** 4. In these Bye-laws:

'box junctions' means areas of roadway enclosed by cross-hatched diagonal yellow lines;

'business hours' means the period from 8.30am to 6.00 pm (8.30 to 18.00) from Monday to Saturday inclusive, on a day which is not a holiday;

'disabled space' means a space provided for the holder of a disabled persons parking permit and indicated by road markings RRM 015 as specified in the Signs Regulations of 1997;

'disabled person' means a person who holds a valid disabled persons parking permit provided the permit is prominently displayed and legible on the vehicle;

‘disabled persons parking permit’ means a permit granted in accordance with Article 43 of the Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) Regulations, 1997 (S.I. 182 of 1997);

‘goods vehicle’ means a vehicle used exclusively for the carriage of goods or burden in the course of trade or business and licensed as a goods vehicle;

‘holiday’ means Good Friday or any day that is a public holiday for the purposes of the Organisation of Working Time Act, 1997;

‘information plate’ means a plate accompanying a traffic sign which indicates the period during which the restrictions or prohibition indicated by such traffic sign applies;

‘loading bay’ means that portion of a road indicated by means of a traffic sign on which, at certain times, a vehicle, other than a goods vehicle being used for loading or unloading, shall not be parked;

‘public road’ means a road over which a public right of way exists and the responsibility for the maintenance of which lies on a road authority;

‘parking space’ means a place on a public road, intended for the parking of a mechanically propelled vehicle;

‘vehicle’ means a mechanically propelled vehicle.

## **PART 2**

### **Schedules of Parking Control**

These Traffic and Parking Bye-laws consist of 7 schedules listed below.

- Schedule 1**      Locations where parking is prohibited at all times (Double yellow lines) except while taking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods
  
- Schedule 2**      Locations where parking is restricted to a period not greater than 2 hours during business hours
  
- Schedule 3**      Locations where parking is restricted to a period not greater than 2 hours during business hours and where vehicles are parked rear or front to kerb
  
- Schedule 4**      Locations where parking is prohibited during business hours (single yellow line) except while taking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods
  
- Schedule 5**      Parking spaces for the exclusive use of disabled drivers
  
- Schedule 6**      Parking spaces restricted for the use of goods vehicles during specified business hours and for a period of not more than 30 minutes
  
- Schedule 7**      Box junctions where parking is prohibited at all times except while taking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods

The extent and duration of the application of these Schedules is outlined on the accompanying Map No.1 entitled 'Ballybay Traffic & Parking Bye-laws, 2008' and on the information plates on the ground.
